



Lutheran World Federation (LWF)

Mission

Department for World Service (DWS) is the internationally recognized humanitarian relief and development agency of the Lutheran World Federation (LWF). LWF/DWS provides emergency humanitarian aid and assists in rehabilitation and development work in over 30 countries worldwide, with programs in Africa, Asia, Latin America/Caribbean, and Europe. Department for World Service reaches out to marginalized and vulnerable poor people whose livelihoods are threatened by the effects of natural and human-made disaster, with special regard to internally displaced persons (IDPs) and refugees. LWF/DWS extends its services without discriminating on the basis of religion, ethnicity, race, sex, caste, nationality or political conviction. LWF is a founding member of the ACT Alliance (Action by Churches Together).

Objective 2: Community empowerment, engagement, outreach and self-reliance is strengthened and expanded, and WGBM are engaged in the planning, implementation & evaluation of services.

Output 2.1 Community based protection mechanisms, outreach and community mobilization strengthened **USD 58,000**

Output 2.4 Community empowerment and self reliance opportunities for refugee and host communities are promoted as part of comprehensive protection interventions. **USD 400,000**

SHELTER SECTOR

Objective 1: Provide adequate shelter for vulnerable SYRs (MWBG) and targeted members of the host community in urban/rural settings outside of camps.

Output 1.4 HH adapt housing to overcome harsh weather conditions **USD 141,243**

WASH SECTOR

Objective 2: Affected populations have access to safe and appropriate sanitation facilities.

Output 2.5 Improvement/extension/rehabilitation of Waste Water systems in areas affected by refugee influx. **USD 635,593**

Objective 3: Affected populations have reduced risk of WASH related diseases through access to improved hygienic practices, hygiene promotion and delivery of hygiene products and services on a sustainable and equitable basis.

Output 3.1 Ensure promotion of hygiene and water conservation among all refugees **USD 35,000**



Additional Sector Information

As of 2014 LWF has acted as an implementing partner for UN agencies such as OCHA. The agency has various MOUs and other working agreements multi- and bi-laterally.

While LWF actively participates in the annual RRP process, the agency also has a separate appeal process through ACT and implements programming in sectors not listed above, for example Food Security.

Geographic Focus

In 2014, interventions will continue in both the camp and host community setting. Zaatari Camp will be the location of camp programming.

Multi-sectoral programming for urban and peri-urban refugees in Jordan's host communities is also on-going. The agency will particularly target Mafraq, Zarqa and Irbid governorates, with some programming in Amman.
