



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	712,555

Highlights

- On 16 April 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 222,102. AFAD reported that during the period of 15-16 April 2014, a total of 64 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 420 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- While in some camps the officials started to refer those in waiting areas to Nusaybin, in Karkamis camp there are still 240 Syrians accommodated in rub hall tents pending authorization from AFAD Hq to be transferred to a camp. UNHCR was informed by provincial directorate of Gaziantep AFAD that they are in close contact with AFAD Ankara and will soon transfer them to a camp where space is made available.
- With the support and advocacy of the UNHCR Field teams in Nizip and Viranehir a vulnerable family reunification case was brought to the attention of the management in both camps. During the week Nizip-1 camp management informed that a woman with her two minor sons (7 and 13 years) in Viranehir camp will be admitted to Nizip-1 to be placed with her step-son and his family.
- In Nusaybin camp, the officials informed that they have started the food card system through AFAD funds. In support the food card system, upon request from the camp management, UNHCR provided more than 800 fridges and another 500 mini-fridges are in the procurement process and expected to be delivered to the camp by the first week of May 2014.
- In Adiyaman Camp in addition to existing vocational training courses, such as carpentry and textile courses new courses like copper craft, wood carving and furniture processing are under consideration as income generation activities. Midyat Sub-governor informed UNHCR that they are planning to start income generating activities in the camp, as a way to both empower the refugees. The authorities in Nusaybin camp are also in discussion with Nusaybin Public Training Centre to determine which vocational courses can be provided in the camp.
