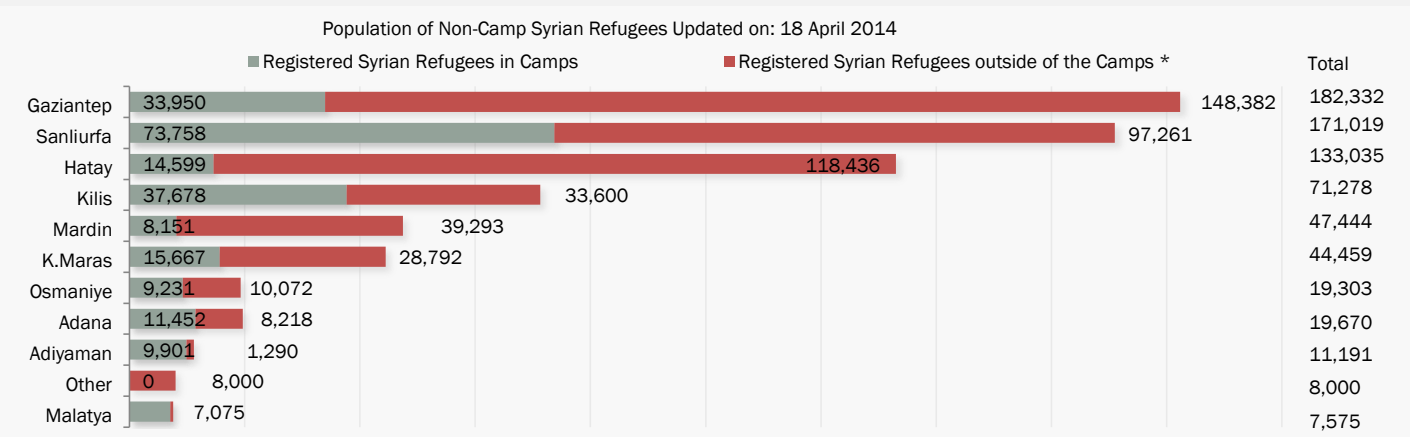
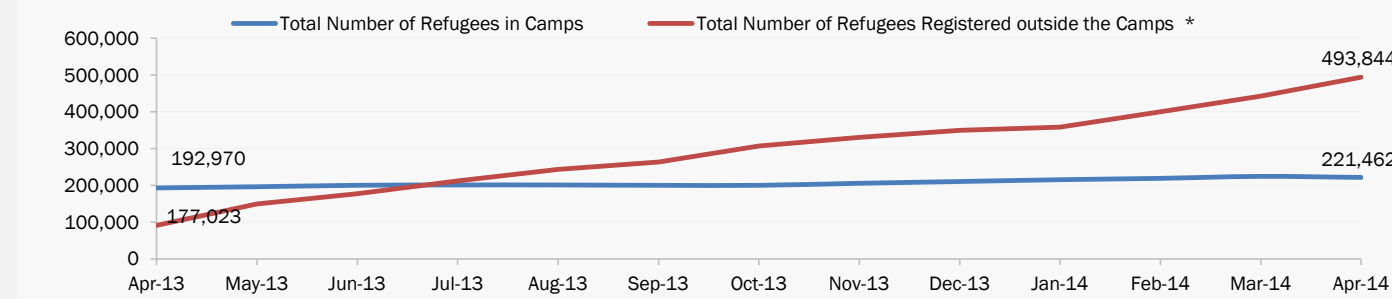

Highlights

- On 20 April 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 221,462. AFAD reported that during the period of 17-20 April 2014, a total of 634 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,274 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- According to the official numbers reported by AFAD, since the beginning of the crisis the number of Syrians registered and accommodated in the camps increased over 480,000 while about 259,000 of them have voluntarily returned to Syria. However it is not known how many of these total arrivals and returns are multiple.
- WFP and the Turkish Red Crescent expanded the E-Food Card Program to Midyat camp in the Mardin province on 1 April. The additional 3,250 beneficiaries raises WFP's caseload to roughly 143,000 Syrians in 16 camps. The expansion occurred under the cost-sharing modality with AFAD whereby WFP uploads 60TL on the e-food card and AFAD uploads 20 TL onto its own card, thereby ensuring that the food entitlement remains unchanged.
- It was reported in the camps that as per instruction from AFAD, as of May 2014, considering the need for the hygiene items of the camp residents, AFAD will load 25 TL (instead of 20TL) to the AFAD Cards while WFP will load 60 TL to WFP/Kizilay cards for food.
- In addition to the 25 TL from AFAD, reportedly there will also be in kind distribution of NFIs mainly consisting of the hygiene items to the beneficiaries based on the donations received. Reportedly the distributions will be done through Kizilay. In most of the camps the officials reported the need of baby diapers. UNHCR already included in its procurement plans the core hygiene kits as well as the diapers both for camp and non-camp population.
- UNICEF informed that upon request from AFAD, they will be providing over 88,000 diapers. Reportedly the items will be delivered to the camps in 10 provinces based on the requests from the camps, and distribution will be done by Kizilay in the camps.
