<b>Item 1. Assistance to unregistered</b> Cécile, SI	<p>A WG on unregistered refugee is established (SI, SCI, HI, Care, DRC, IOM, Medair, IRC, ECHO. DfID).</p> <p>The objective is to agree on an assistance package and kind of assistance, decisions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No changes for the time being</li> <li>• From July onwards provide similar assistance as registered (250 USD/HH/month regardless of HH size).</li> <li>• Duration of assistance: 3 months (then advocate for registration through case management).</li> <li>• E-voucher for food assistance not decided yet, needs donor support and food parcel is easier.</li> <li>• Protection issues to be discussed.</li> </ul> <p>SCI will implement a project through ATM cards for 2'100 HH (10'000 HH identified). Targeting according to Burden Index (question to UNHCR on the formula). Amount 120 USD/HH/month.</p> <p><b>Actions</b>            <a href="#">UNHCR needs to facilitate/accelerate registration process</a> <a href="#">More information on numbers, profile, etc. is needed.</a></p>
<b>Item 2. Assistance to Newcomers</b> Chadi, UNHCR	<p>NFI-WG is currently reviewing the possibility to move from in kind to cash assistance.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No change is foreseen for the time being (NFI kit + food parcel).</li> <li>• DRC is hosting a database on newcomers.</li> <li>• ECHO supports the process of aligning the price of the in kind assistance.</li> <li>• Solidarites is conducting a phone survey with newcomers (200HH), 57% would prefer cash instead of in kind.</li> <li>• NFI-WG has set the limit from newcomer to become unregistered at 30 days (this limit does not reach consensus; some agencies apply a 3 month limit).</li> <li>• TdH is implementing a cash project for newcomers.</li> </ul> <p><b>Actions</b>            <a href="#">None as long as cash assistance is not planned for Newcomers</a> <a href="#">Follow-up on TdH project (any info there?)</a></p>
<b>Item 3. Update on Task-Groups</b> <b>a. Targeting</b> Francesca, IRC	<p>The objective is to come up with a reliable socio-economic vulnerability index permitting pre-identification of vulnerable HH. <b>Exp. deadline: end May</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A test survey using an extended questionnaire with 350 HH is planned to start in two weeks.</li> <li>• Discussion on gold standard is ongoing (exp/capita or other indicators).</li> <li>• Best method for the time being is a mix of dependency ratio and family size.</li> </ul> <p><b>Actions</b>            <a href="#">Provide key messages on targeting to all stakeholders.</a> <a href="#">Contribute to the INQAL.</a></p>

<p><b>b. MEB</b> Cécile, SI</p>	<p>MEB is finalized (607 USD/Month/Family of 5). It should not be confused with the SMEB (Survival MEB – 435 USD) which only purpose is to define minimal contribution to selected beneficiaries:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <u>Reminder:</u> recommendation from MEB task group for the assistance package is: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- \$250/HH/Month for the severely vulnerable (Tier 1) – est. 8% reg. ref.</li> <li>- \$150/HH/Month for the highly vulnerable (Tier 2) - 25/30% reg. ref.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• The MEB is higher than the NPTP threshold (112 USD/Month/Pers =&gt; 560 USD/Month/Family of 5), and official minimal wage (450 USD/Month).</li> </ul> <p><b>Actions</b>                      <a href="#">Key message on why MEB is higher than other estimations (rent?).</a> <a href="#">Gather information on how much Lebanese poor pay for rent.</a></p>
<p><b>c. Market Ass.</b> Nicholas, KDS</p>	<p>KDS is in country and starting the consultancy (funded by ECHO). The objective is to assess market structures that shall be affected by CTP. <b>First Analysis in three weeks</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• It is a complex work that normally needs time but has to be done quickly.</li> <li>• KDS is preparing the questionnaires and sampling methods.</li> <li>• They will also meet with whole sale actors to evaluate impact at that level.</li> </ul> <p><b>Actions</b>                      <a href="#">Solidarites (Cecile) to provide data already collected.</a> <a href="#">Nicholas Skibiak (nskibiak@kdsconsult.com) will contact some of us.</a></p>
<p><b>d. M&amp;E</b> Burgen, IRC</p>	<p>Consultant is in country (funded by IRC). The objective is to gather information on M&amp;E methodologies applied and develop a framework to be adopted by CTP actors. <b>Exp. deadline: end May</b></p> <p><b>Action</b>                      <a href="#">Marcus Catsam (marcuscatsam@hotmail.com) will contact Agencies</a></p>
<p><b>e. Op. Set up</b> Heidi, DfID</p>	<p>Consultant (Avenir) is following the planned schedule. <b>Final report end of April</b></p> <p>On April 8<sup>th</sup> a workshop was organized (Avenir consultants + Core Group ) to present findings on the two first components of the scope of work:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Scope &amp; use of unconditional cash grants</li> <li>2) Current operational set-up</li> </ol> <p>Next workshop (April 28<sup>th</sup> ) will cover the three remaining components:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>3) Critical areas for improvement</li> <li>4) Recommendations for the future operational set-up</li> <li>5) Actions to implement the recommended operational set-up.</li> </ol> <p>On April 30<sup>th</sup> Heads of Agencies and key actors in CTP should convene to discuss the findings and recommendations of the consultancy.</p>
<p><b>f. Acc. &amp; Comm.</b> Heidi, DfID</p>	<p>Mass communication strategy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• UNHCR is testing a Q&amp;A to communicate on the Agency’s shift in programming.</li> <li>• Once the test is completed, the INQAL shall be finalized</li> </ul> <p>Data management/Data protection</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Proposal from the Core Group to improve compliance on Data Sharing Agr.</li> <li>• Proposal to create a page on unconditional cash assistance in Activity Info (not supported by certain agencies which reports against sectorial activities).</li> </ul>

	<p>Accountability (Rami – Care)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Referral mechanism and feedback from assessments to be improved.</li> <li>Use of ODK (Open Data Kits) to file complaints during PDMs</li> </ul> <p><b>Actions</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Core Group to reignite the INQAL process.</li> <li>UNHCR to clarify its mass communication strategy</li> <li>UNHCR to test dedicated page on Activity Info.</li> </ul>
<b>Item 4. UNHCR</b> Ivan, UNHCR	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Last winterization uploads still pending (planned for end of next week).</li> <li>Unconditional Cash Assistance Project waiting for final targeting method to be defined to establish the first list of eligible beneficiaries.</li> <li>With limited funding capacity (36 mio USD), applying the 250 USD/HH minimal amount means the first round of beneficiaries for May will be reduced to 7'500 HH (instead of 12'000 planned) out of a total of 230'000 registered HH (3%).</li> </ul>
<b>Item 6. AOB</b>	Leonie (ACAPS) informs that the <b>MSNA</b> (Multi Sector Needs Assessment) is being reviewed by the Steering Committee. <b>Report will be published by the end of April.</b>
