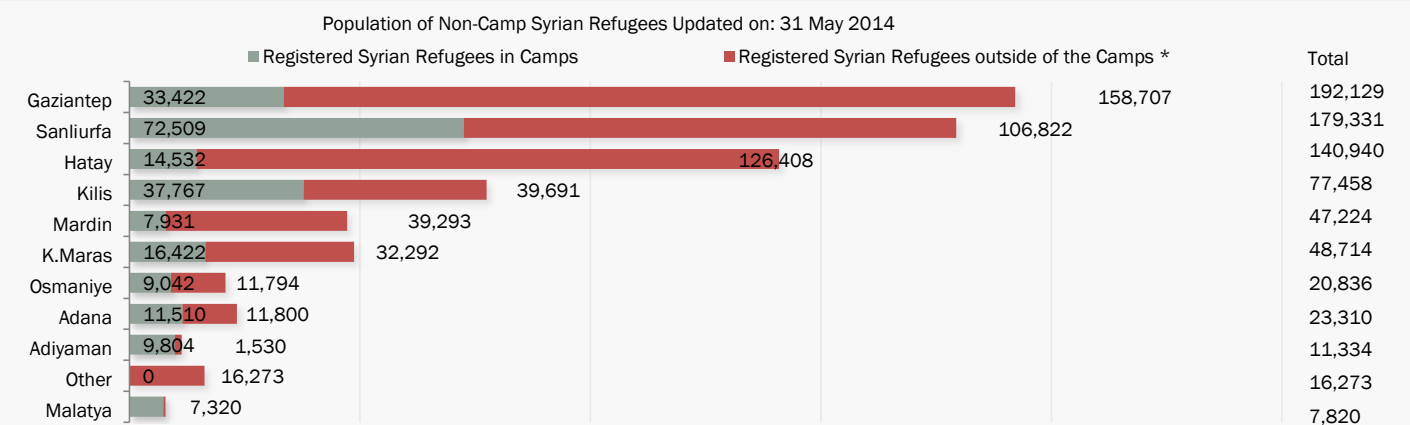
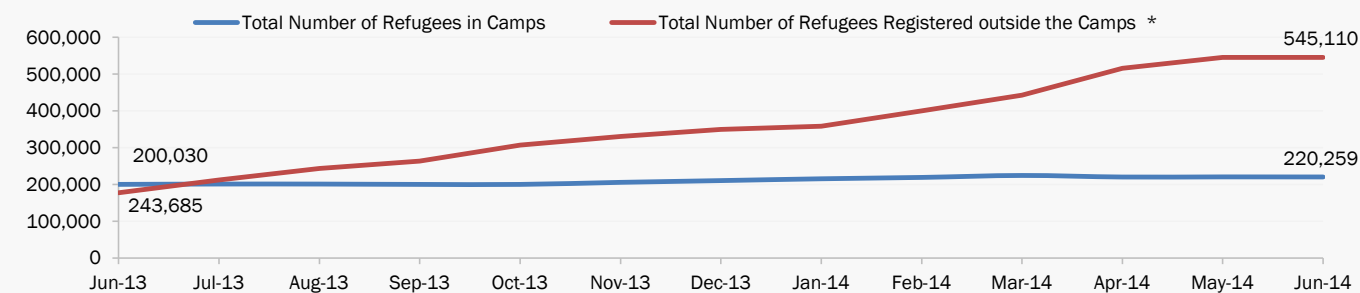
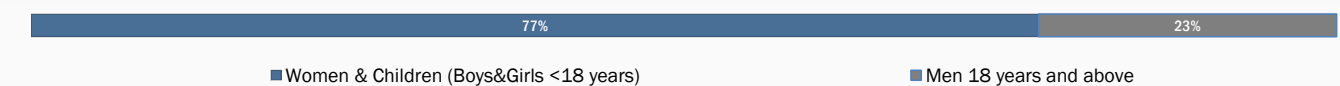

Highlights

- On 02 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220,259. AFAD reported that during the period of 01-02 June 2014, a total of 133 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 324 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Mardin/Nusaybin camp, officials informed UNHCR that 39 new arrivals approached the camp and requested to be admitted. A UNHCR team spoke to some of the new arrivals and about 20 of them (5 families) stated that they had come from Aleppo and crossed the border at Kilis. The new arrivals reportedly requested to be admitted at other camps first (Nizip etc.), and then found their way to Nusaybin. The officials informed UNHCR that they were first taken to the Senyurt border gate, fingerprinted and then brought back to the camp and admitted in cooperation with local authorities. Camp officials also informed UNHCR that they are expecting another 20 persons from Rize as per instructions from AFAD Hq., however the group has not arrived at the camp yet.
- In Nizip-1 camp, officials informed UNHCR that the number of families temporarily accommodated in the camp waiting area has increased to 7 families (about 34 persons), due to capacity shortages. The camp officials said they will accommodate them in the family tents if/when a tent becomes available (usually due to the voluntary return to Syria of a camp resident).
- The German NGO WHH informed UNHCR that they are planning to start an assistance program (funded by ECHO) to non-camp Syrians living in Ceylanpinar/Urfa, and Kiziltepe/Mardin. Through this program, the NGO is planning to provide assistance to about 1,700 families (approx. 8,500 persons).
- UNICEF informed UNHCR that they have provided school furniture to the schools in Kilis and Urfa (city center, Akcakale, Ceylanpinar and Viransehir). The furniture was delivered to the local authorities during the last two weeks in May, to be used in the schools in camps as well as those in the community.
