

### Highlights

- On 10 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,430. AFAD reported that during the period of 09-10 June 2014, a total of 226 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 280 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Mardin, a UNHCR team visited one of the schools for non-camp Syrians. Officials at the school informed UNHCR that, since the educational semester is over due to the summer holiday break, they have started to organize a vocational course (sewing class) for non-camp Syrian women living in Mardin province. The course is supported by Istanbul Municipality's Vocational Course Center (ISMEK), and it is reported that there are about 60 women registered for the sewing class. There are four teachers in the center, two of whom are Syrian.
- The vocational course center of Istanbul metropolitan municipality (ISMEK) has vocational courses on various subjects such as jewelry making, cooking, carpentry and computer classes in various locations: two in Istanbul, two in Mardin (city center and Kiziltepe), and two in Sanliurfa (Ceylanpinar and Viransehir).
- A UNHCR Field team was informed that Welt Hunger Hilfe (a German NGO) and IMPR have completed their initial assessment to identify vulnerable families targeting up to 8,000 individuals (4,500 in Kiziltepe and 3,500 in Ceylanpinar) for support. The NGO will now start to distribute cash assistance to those selected families through cards.
- In Nizip-2, camp officials informed UNHCR that the Religious Affairs Presidency requested all of its provincial offices to identify vulnerable families (female headed households, mainly widows) and are planning to provide shelter for these families.
- A Turkish NGO informed a UNHCR field team that they are planning to provide food packages for the month of Ramadan. The NGO informed UNHCR that they have some 2000 food packages, and would like to distribute 1,000 of them to Syrian families.
