



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	773,864

Highlights

- On 11 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,096. AFAD reported that during the period of 10-11 June 2014, a total of 171 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 505 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Akcakale camp, officials informed UNHCR that they have admitted and registered the 22 families that have been waiting at the gate of the camp for some time. Officials stated that the families were placed in tents left vacant by families who voluntarily returned to Syria. In Adiyaman camp, officials stated that there are about 75 Syrians in the waiting area outside the camp who cannot be admitted to the camp due to capacity shortages. In Karkamis camp, officials identified about 400 visitors who had been temporarily allowed to enter the camp to visit their relatives who have not left the camp and continue to remain there with their relatives.
- The women's committees of both Akcakale and Harran camps held a meeting together in Akcakale camp. At the meeting, both committees shared their experiences and discussed how to organize joint activities and projects in cooperation and coordination with each other as well as with their camp managements. UNHCR has been advocating for the establishment of such committees (women, youth and elderly etc.) and will continue to support the women's committees of both camps in their initiatives to work together.
- In Suruc, officials informed UNHCR that the border gate there is open two days per week (on Mondays and Thursdays) for those who approach the authorities and request to return to Syria voluntarily. Officials informed UNHCR that on each of those days they facilitate the safe return of approximately 250-300 persons. Officials also stated that they admit approximately 100 persons to Turkey on each of those days, roughly half of whom are injured people, a quarter regards persons who accompany them, as well as some others who approach the gate to cross to Turkey.
