



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	795,524

Highlights

- On 29 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,952. AFAD reported that during the period of 26-29 June 2014, a total of 1,040 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 721 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR Field Teams were informed that, as per instruction from AFAD, all camp managements will start to remove the makeshift annexes to tents that refugees have built. These makeshift annexes pose a fire hazard, due to the proximity of the tents, and must be removed. In Karkamis camp, the officials informed UNHCR that they have discussed this with the camp district leaders (muktars) and, in order not to create any tension with the refugees, they will start dismantling the annexes of the muktars's tents first.
- In Osmaniye camp, officials informed UNHCR that in the same letter received from AFAD, they were also informed and instructed not to allow any relatives or friends of the refugees into the residential areas of the camp, but instead to allocate a visitors tent for them at the camp entrance to allow the refugees to be visited by their relatives and friends. The letter also indicated that AFAD cards, which are used to purchase food items in the camps, can now also be used for NFIs, including hygiene materials and clothes, from the markets in the camps.
- A UNHCR Field Team visited a school that was recently opened by Syrians and supported by Turkish NGOs and an association called Syrian Unity and Assistance. The school staff reported that they are in contact with the local authorities and that currently they have about 160 children registered between the ages of 6 and 15 years old. There are about 15 female teachers and a psychologist working at the school. The initial target group of children is orphans who are identified in the city center. The plan is to allocate some space within the school premises to be used as a dormitory for any children who may be coming from other provinces.
- In Osmaniye, camp officials informed UNHCR that a new school was opened in the city center for non-camp Syrian children. Some 1,800 children will reportedly benefit from the school in the next semester, however during the summer months the school will also be used to provide supplementary education for the children. A UNHCR Field Team will visit the school shortly.
