



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	795,524

Highlights

- On 01 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,952. AFAD reported that during the period of 30 June-01 July 2014, a total of 285 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 203 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Kilis Elbeyli camp, officials reported that they have identified some containers which have been left empty by the households to which they were most recently assigned. The camp management will now deregister the families who have left these containers from the camp records. Officials stated that they will identify some vulnerable families living in destitute conditions in the city center and admit them to the camp, to be accommodated in the available containers.
- A UNHCR Field team met with the provincial directorate of Ministry of Family and Social Policies (MoFSP), in Sanliurfa. Officials informed the team that they are working together with a local NGO that will provide shelter to unaccompanied minors who are over 12 years old. Officials stated that this is a joint project together with AFAD, MoFSP, Ministry of National Education (MoNE), and Ministry of Youth and Sports (MoYS), with AFAD and MoFSP monitoring the shelter. Reportedly, MoNE will ensure that these children will have access to education. While AFAD will be working on the identification of unaccompanied children, MoFSP will be assessing their conditions and need to be placed in this shelter.
- In Adana, UNHCR was informed that there are about six schools in the city center that are providing education to the children of non-camp Syrians living in the city. There are reportedly about 3,000 children attending these schools, and another two prefabricated schools will be built in the town. UNHCR field team visited one of these schools, set within a Turkish school, and was informed that the school is funded by a Turkish NGO.
- In Adana, the number of registered non-camp Syrians has reached almost 13,000. Local authorities informed UNHCR that they would like to have another mobile coordination center to help reduce the workload of the current one. The local officials in Seyhan district informed UNHCR that they are providing cash assistance through SASF (Social Assistance and Solidarity
