Summary of discussions and action points

1.	Registration update by Rana Ksaifi – Registration Officer
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Current situation: 1,121,680 registered and awaiting registration. June is the lowest number registered in 2014 in part due to the Bekaa offices moving. Registration will probably be even lower next month due to Ramadan. Mobile Registration started in Chebaa and Wadi Khaled Renewal-Verification Questionnaire was developed; however, there was a technical problem, which resulted in a low number of inactivations for the month. June Thematic Registration Questionnaire finalized (1,411 HH Surveyed) with the objective to better understand Access to water and Mitigating Measures. Detailed report will be uploaded on the web portal. Inter-agency tracking tool for referrals was developed to provide better analysis but very few referrals were made <p>Action:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Partners requested to use the IA referral tool in a more systematic manner.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 70 % Lebanese children are in private schools Funding Required is 206 million USD (41% funded) 140,609 children enrolled in formal education 2013 / 2014 School Year (add the ratios: (a) first/second shift and (b) Syrians/Lebanese) Total children in learning: 206,435 (Most beneficiaries are Syrian Refugees (81%)) Upcoming Summer Activities and Programmes- Pending approval from MEHE resulting in delayed start to activities Priority for the 2014/2015 School Year is to keep current children in school while expanding services to more children Reaching All Children with Education (RACE) is a three-year strategic document led by MEHE to increase access / quality to formal and non-formal learning opportunities (413,000 Beneficiaries) – Total Budget 599.9 million USD

3.	RRP6 mid-year review by Anne Marie Kerrigan – Deriche- Senior Coordination Officer
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ UNHCR Lebanon launched the RRP6 mid-year review appeal on 3 July 2014 at the Grand Serail. The Minister of Social Affairs hosted the event with the Ministers of Economy, Education, and Health, in presence of Ambassadors, Heads of UN agencies and I/N NGOs. ▪ The Minister of Social Affairs made an opening statement highlighting the socio-economic impact the Syrian refugee crisis has had on Lebanon. ▪ Ninette Kelley highlighted the achievements to date and underlined the consequences of under-funding, noting that the needs outstripped the resources. ▪ Questions and answers with interventions from Ambassadors and NGOs concerning: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Impact of decrease in the appeal ○ GOL fundraising plan ○ Focus on Social cohesion ○ Recognition of local capacity and the importance to invest on capacity building programmes. ○ Further prioritization of targeting the most vulnerable and linking between humanitarian response and long-term stabilization
