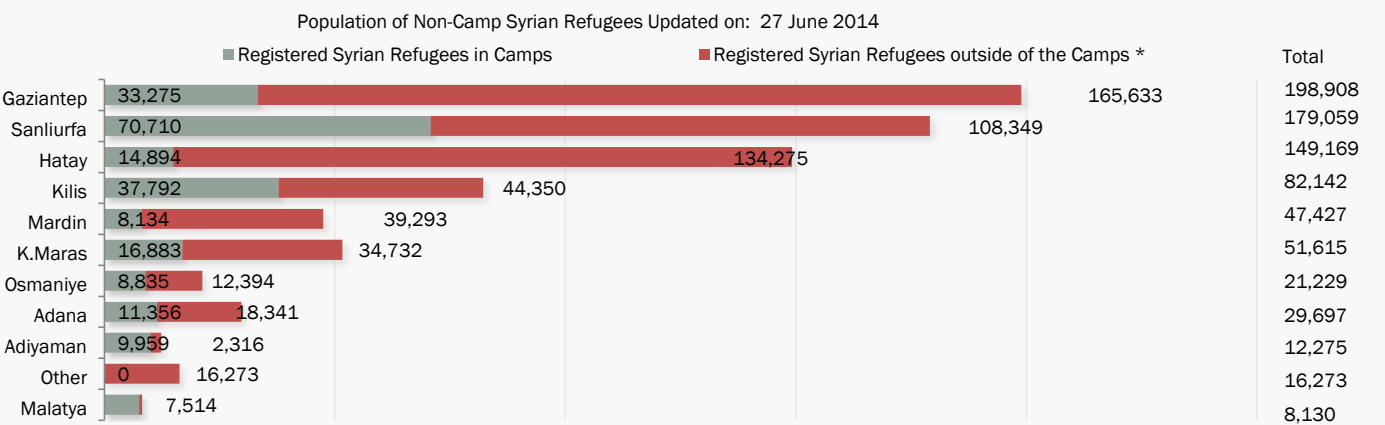
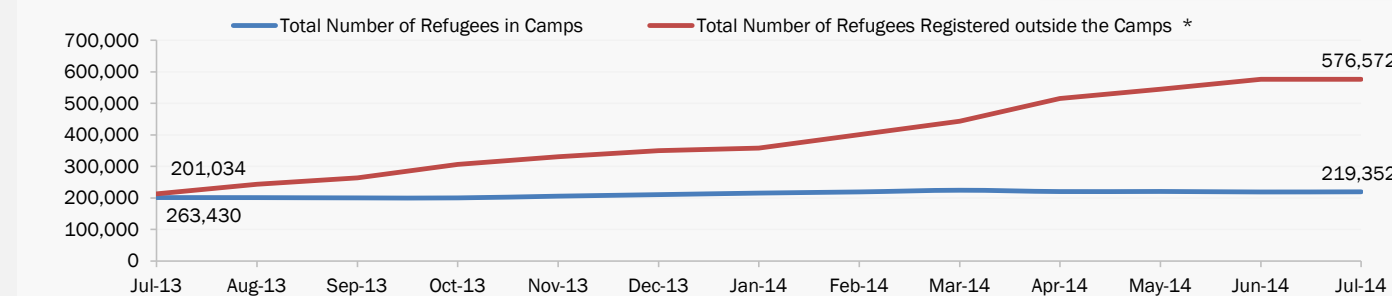


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	795,924

Highlights

- On 03 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,352. AFAD reported that during the period of 02-03 July 2014, a total of 506 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 308 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Adiyaman, officials informed UNHCR that they have accommodated 84 Syrians who were temporarily staying in the waiting area of Adiyamn camp to Nusaybin camp. The camp officials also informed UNHCR that another group of 26 Syrians will be transferred to Nizip camp, where they were previously registered.
- In Ceylanpinar, local authorities requested provincial AFAD for the Syrians who have no accommodation in the town and have been living in parks, as well as those who approach to gate of Ceylanpinar camp, to be transferred to Nusaybin. However, even though AFAD organized transportation for approximately 50 persons, only 17 Syrians could be reached and agreed to be transported to Nusaybin camp.
- A UNHCR Team visited local officials in Suruc town of Sanliurfa. There is a border gate in Suruc, but without customs capacity. Local authorities informed UNHCR that the gate is mainly used for the safe crossing of Syrians who want to return to Syria. Officials reported that the gate operates two days per week. In addition to the approximately 800 to 1000 persons crossing through the gate to Syria, approximately 100-200 medical cases and their companions are also admitted to Turkey during the two days the gate is operational.
- In Karkamis, camp staff informed UNHCR that there are approximately 70 families (approx. 600 persons) living in the town. Officials reported that the majority of these non-camp Syrians in Karkamis are not yet registered with the police despite all the efforts by the local officials advising them to do so. Local officials (SASF) also informed UNHCR that about 8 Syrian families are living in a mosque in Karkamis and that they are being provided assistance (food packages etc.) by SASF and are supported by the local community.
