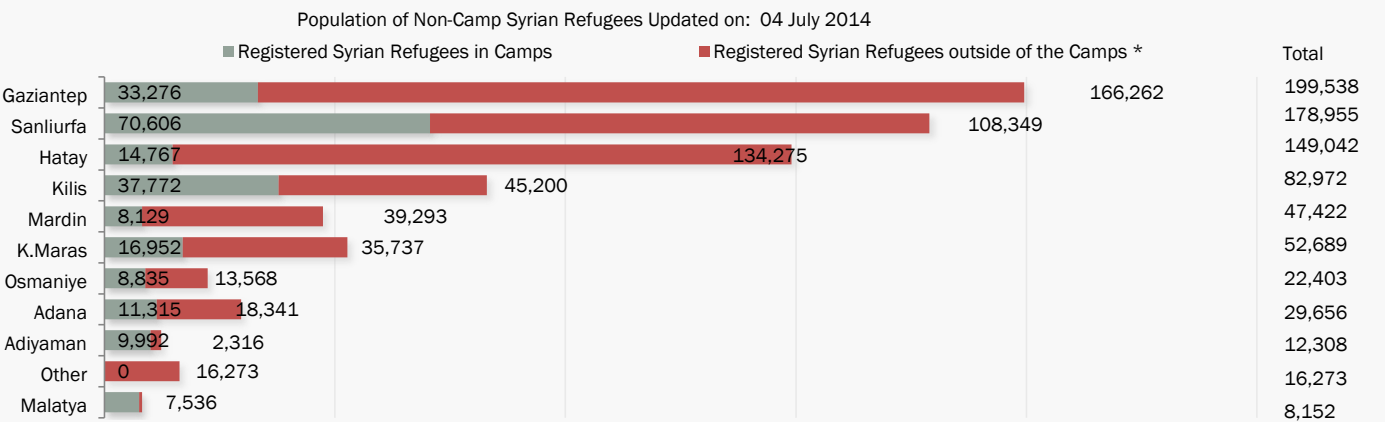
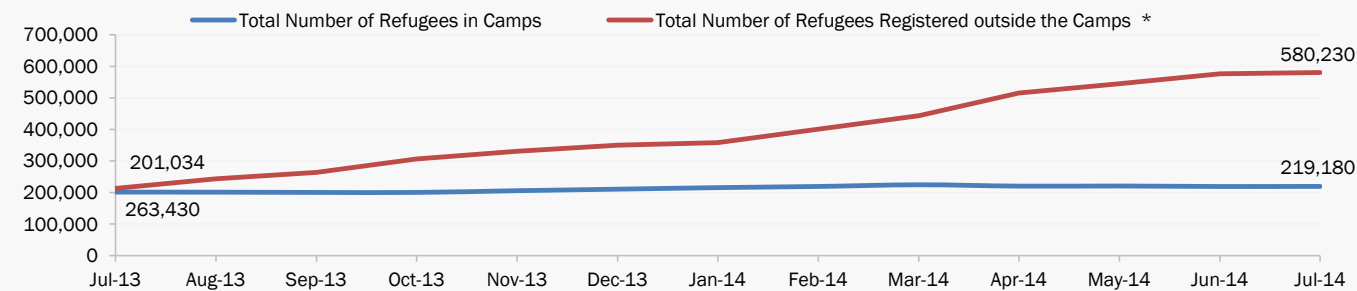
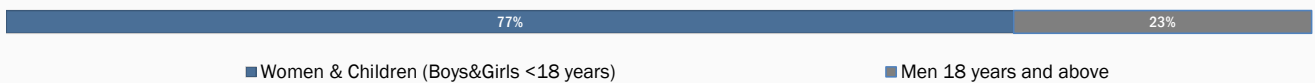


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	799,410

Highlights

- On 10 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,180. AFAD reported that during the period of 09-10 July 2014, a total of 264 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 311 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Reyhanli town of Hatay province, local authorities informed UNHCR that the registration of non-camp Syrians is almost completed, and that as of 11 July 2014 more than 43,000 Syrian refugees have been registered. Officials stated that the mobile coordination center that was used for registration has been sent to Gaziantep (this was also confirmed by local authorities in Gaziantep). Officials also reported that they will keep one desk within the police premises in Reyhanli operational to register any possible new arrivals.
- UNHCR was also informed that one of the mobile coordination centers was sent to Mersin and has already started to register non-camp Syrians living there. Local authorities estimate that there are about 55-60 thousand Syrians living in Mersin, including about 11,000 who have already been issued ikamets (temporary residence permits).
- In Kahramanmaraş province the local authorities informed UNHCR that they have registered more than 35,000 non-camp Syrians, more than 2,500 of whom were also issued ikamets (temporary residence permits). Officials reported that only about 5% of the people registered are residing in Turkoglu and Elbistan towns, however it is estimated that the number of Syrians in Elbistan town is higher than the number registered. Officials reported that they are providing assistance through donations they receive (food packages and NFIs) to Syrians living in the city.
- Local officials in Kahramanmaraş informed UNHCR that approximately 70 Syrians are living in an empty field near the camp in makeshift tents. In consultation with AFAD Ankara, camp officials spoke with the Syrians to transfer them to Nusaybin camp, however only 17 individuals agreed to be transferred to the camp, while the rest preferred to remain in the city for potential work opportunities. The camp officials will continue to try to convince those remaining to be transferred Nusaybin.
