




Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	805,343

Highlights

- On 13 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220,036. AFAD reported that during the period of 11-13 July 2014, a total of 1,243 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 387 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- A UNHCR field team met with the head of the Syrian Education Association, a Syrian business man who also supports Syrian refugees in Turkey. The head of the association informed UNHCR that there are about 120 schools run by Syrians in Turkey, and approximately 150,000 Syrian children are attending these schools. There are reportedly about 3,000 Syrian volunteer teachers working in such schools, and they are paid about 300-400 TL as incentives. The schools are in close contact with the Syrian Education Commission affiliated with the Syrian National Council.
- In Ceylanpinar, the camp officials informed UNHCR that during the weekend they have admitted a family of 7 persons to the camp due to their vulnerability, and 3 more families (approx. 19 persons) are still in the waiting area. Camp officials informed UNHCR that they are trying their best to accommodate such spontaneous arrivals, however due to space shortages they can not respond immediately. Camp officials stated that during the month of June 2014, they accommodated about 452 spontaneous arrivals. Reportedly, about 330 Syrians were de-registered from the camp during the same period for various reasons.
- In Akcakale camp, officials informed UNHCR that the planned presentations of the women's committee to raise awareness against minor marriages will start after the Eid holiday. Depending on the population of each district, the women's committee is targeting to reach 100-200 women in each district in the camp, targeting a total of more than 1,000 women across 10 districts to raise awareness against minor marriages.
- The camp management in Akcakale is also planning to set up sewing workshops for men in the camp as an income generation activity. The management is negotiating with a private company that will set up the facility. The UNHCR team suggested to include disabled men among the program beneficiaries as well.
