



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	<b>805,066</b>

### Highlights

- On 15 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,759. AFAD reported that during the period of 14-15 July 2014, a total of 27 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 269 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Mardin, the local officials informed UNHCR that, as of the first week of July 2014, the number of non-camp Syrians registered by the police in the coordination center is 10,545. The police informed UNHCR that while registration is ongoing in the coordination center in Mardin city center, there are also spontaneous returns through the Senyurt border gate in Kiziltepe.
- According to the information from officials, about 1,900 Syrians' safe crossings were facilitated by the police through the Senyurt border during the first week of July 2014. Officials informed UNHCR that during 2013, more than 61,000 Syrians' safe crossings have been facilitated through Senyurt gate from Turkey to Syria. During the first six months of 2014 more than 52,000 Syrians have returned to Syria through Senyurt gate, however it is not known how many of these returns are multiple returns.
- In Sanliurfa, a UNHCR team met with the office of religious affairs and was informed that the office of the religious affairs has distributed coupons from a supermarket chain to vulnerable families. Reportedly, while their main target group was local families they have also distributed 50 TL coupons per family to 600 Syrian families. Officials informed UNHCR that the Syrian family beneficiaries were identified through a school that the children of the families were attending. The office of the religious affairs also reported that they are planning to do another distribution before the Eid holiday, and they have also distributed cash assistance to some families through the Syrian Assistance Platform.
- In Nusaybin camp, the head of education informed UNHCR that they have started courses given by professional teachers to the volunteer teachers. The topics of the training include sharing their experience, how to treat children, understanding child psychology, teaching methodologies and capacity development.
