


Highlights

- On 30 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,270. AFAD reported that during the period of 29-30 July 2014, a total of 426 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 428 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Kilis, the police officers registering the non-camp Syrians informed that they started give appointments for registrations. Reportedly the registration of those who were enumerated by AFAD previously has been completed therefore AFAD is not giving appointments anymore. While giving appointments the police considers vulnerabilities and prioritizes female headed households, families with children and medical cases. As of end of July more than 46,000 non-camp Syrians have been registered in Kilis.
- In Akcakale, the camp officials informed that during July 2014, they have received some 10,000 t-shirts and 10,000 caps and 10 wheelchairs from the national NGO Deniz Feneri. Reportedly the camp management distributed half of the t-shirts and the others will be distributed in the coming days. In addition the camp management also received 60 rolls of fabric cloth which they will use in the vocational course to make clothes for the beneficiaries.
- In Kahramanmaraş, the camp officials informed that the German Red Cross has provided 3 deliveries of hygiene kits (3,200 pack each time) two of which they have distributed. The camp officials are planning to distribute the 3rd batch in August. The management is expecting a 4th round of donations of 3,200 kits in the coming months.
- In Islahiye the camp officials stated that they are facing a shortage of water. Camp officials stated that while they are working on solving the water problem with another borehole which they have identified, as an interim solution they have started to provide water to the camp residents through fire-trucks. UNHCR's WASH and Public Health officer will visit the camp to give advice and discuss with the authorities possible support.
