


Highlights

- On 06 August 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,590. AFAD reported that during the period of 05-06 August 2014, a total of 370 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 551 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Viransehir, the camp officials informed that the local authorities have gathered about 50-60 non-camp Syrians in Viransehir town while begging on the streets. and referred them to Viransehir camp. Reportedly the officials started to take action after the circular sent by Government to all provinces. Viransehir camp officials informed that they have registered these people to the camp records however about 20 of them refused to stay in the camp and would like to return to Syria. UNHCR team will meet the group to understand their situation in more details.
- In Harran Camp, the education officer informed UNHCR team that during the semester of 2013-2014, they had more than 4,500 children which is almost 30% of the camp population were registered as students. The head of education informed that last year they have observed some drop outs and decrease in attendance to the classes, so this year they are planning to conduct a survey and visit the families. The camp management has assigned some 11 teachers and other staff from the management who will conduct the assessment and encourage the families to send their children to school.
- In Harran camp, in addition to the children to the school, the school manager informed that there are also about 170 children at kindergarten classes and they are organizing supplementary classes for them to catch-up the next semester. The head of education also mentioned that there are 2 female students who are granted a 4-year fully funded scholarship in France. Reportedly the scholarship application was done through the Syrian Education Commission and only 5 students were granted of whom 2 are in Harran camp. Camp officials also informed that they have about 150 adults who are attending to the vocational courses. The vocational courses are on various areas like; carpet weaving, embroidery, felt design and sewing etc.
- In Osmaniye camp the camp manager informed UNHCR team that he will conduct a survey among the women to get their opinions on what types of vocational courses they would like to have. Based on their common and highly requested course he will request the teacher from the Public Education Department in the city. UNHCR Field Team suggested that he could also do the same for the males which will also be useful for them to be self-sufficient.
