



ACTED (Agency for Technical Cooperation and Development)

Mission

ACTED has been working in Jordan since 2005, supporting projects across the Middle East and North Africa. In 2011 ACTED became fully operational in Jordan through a youth and sexual reproductive health project. Following the influx of displaced Syrians into Jordan into 2012, ACTED has been working in both camps and host communities, providing emergency water, hygiene, cash, shelter and sanitation assistance to Syrians and vulnerable Jordanians, as well as addressing information gaps through the REACH initiative. This targeted, needs-based humanitarian assistance is being complemented by a longer-term focus on recovery and rehabilitation, with medium-term interventions focusing on shelter and livelihoods. Addressing the wider development context in Jordan, ACTED's emphasis is on supporting and strengthening civil society and reproductive health and rights, with a focus on youth and gender issues.



Upon review in July 2014, ACTED has appealed for a revised total of **USD 10,165,000**

CASH SECTOR

Objective 1: Ensure that the needs of extremely vulnerable Syrian refugees as well as Jordanians affected by the refugee crisis are covered across Jordan.

FOOD SECURITY SECTOR

Objective 2: Improve food security including food availability, access and utilisation for vulnerable Jordanian populations through targeted food production and livelihood interventions.

Output 2.2 Vulnerable Jordanian families living in areas with high concentration of Syrian refugees provided with livelihood opportunities **USD 650,000**

Objective 4: Ensure effective and coordinated sectoral response through evidence-based food security and livelihood interventions.

Output 4.3 Comprehensive (quantitative and geographically significant) food security and livelihood assessments conducted taking into account the different and special needs of women, girls, boys and men. **USD 200,000**

HEALTH SECTOR

Objective 3: Support the capacity of the national health care system to provide services to Syrian women, girls, boys and men and vulnerable Jordanians in the most affected by the end of 2014.

Output 3.3 Access to primary and essential secondary and tertiary health care supported **USD 0**

WASH SECTOR

Objective 1: Affected population are ensured with safe, equitable and sustainable access to sufficient quantity of water for drinking, cooking and personal and domestic hygiene

Output 1.3 Improve access to safe water to vulnerable Syrian refugees and Jordanians living in urban and rural host communities including schools and other public places **USD 2,487,000**

Objective 2: Affected populations have access to safe and appropriate sanitation facilities.

Output 2.4 Improve access to sanitation facilities to vulnerable Syrian refugees and Jordanians living in urban and rural host communities including schools and other public places **USD 1,228,000**

Objective 3. Affected populations have reduced risk of WASH related diseases through access to improved hygienic practices, hygiene promotion and delivery of hygiene products and services on a sustainable and equitable basis.

Output 3.2 Raise awareness on hygiene and water conversation among Syrian refugees and Jordanians in the host communities **USD 900,000**

PROTECTION SECTOR

Objective 1: Refugees fleeing Syria are able to access the territory, to seek asylum and their rights are respected.

Output 1.3 Quality of registration and profiling improved (age and gender disaggregated data), and quality of reception conditions improved and maintained. **USD 50,000**

Objective 2: Community empowerment, engagement, outreach and self-reliance is strengthened and expanded, and women, girls, boys and men are engaged in the planning, implementation and evaluation of services

Output 2.2 Coexistence with local communities **USD 100,000**

Output 2.4 Community empowerment and self reliance opportunities for refugee and host communities are promoted as part of comprehensive protection interventions. **USD 400,000**

Objective 4: Community empowerment, engagement, outreach and self-reliance is strengthened and expanded, and women, girls, boys and men are engaged in the planning, implementation and evaluation

Output 4.2 CP prevention activities are increased, including through the strengthening of CBCPCs and other community structures. **USD 50,000**

Objective 1: Provide adequate shelter for vulnerable Syrians (MWBG) and targeted members of the host community in urban/rural settings outside of camps.

Output 1.4 HH adapt housing to overcome harsh weather conditions **USD 300,000**

Output 1.5 Increased awareness/knowledge about tenure obligations and rights **USD 200,000**

NFI SECTOR

Objective 1: Ensure that the basic HH needs of MWBG are met.

Output 1.2 Provision of basic HH items to mitigate harsh weather conditions **USD 1,140,000**

Output 1.3 Essential sanitary items provided **USD 860,000**

Additional Sector Information

In addition, ACTED is an implementing partner in camps and host communities for several UN agencies who have also appealed under the RRP6 including; 26 Million USD from UNICEF for WASH projects in Za'atari and host communities, 830,000 USD for food distributions in Azraq from WPP; 1 Million USD for community support projects from UNHCR and 500,000 USD from OCHA ERF for cash assistance and establishment of referral mechanisms.

Geographic Information

In 2014, ACTED plans to intervene across the country in camps and host communities covering;

- Za'atari, King Abdullah Park, Cyber City, and Azraq camps

and

-Irbid, Jerash, Ajloun, Mafraq, and Zarqa governorates.
