




Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	832,528

Highlights

- On 14 August, AFAD, the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Turkey's Government, announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in the 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,806. AFAD reported that from 23 to 24 August, a total of 1,205 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 787 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR Field teams were informed that the university applications for Syrians who passed the TOMER's Turkish language proficiency test are ongoing. In Akcakale, camp officials reported that three students have already been admitted to BA degree programs at the Gaziantep University while several others have applied to the Harran University and are waiting for the admissions decision. In Altinozu camp, several applications to online university education programs run by Asia University in Malaysia and funded by ROSHD foundation are also awaiting the admissions decision.
- Camp officials in Ceylanpinar informed UNHCR that the camp had no more room to admit around 40 persons transferred from Akcakale. These persons were accommodated in the waiting area, but later some of them decided to leave the camp.
- In Karkamis, camp officials informed UNHCR that there are about 50 Syrians living in makeshift tents in front of the camp waiting to be admitted. Reportedly some of them claimed to have come from Gaziantep while others declared to be new arrivals. The camp management cannot admit them because the camp is at capacity. UNHCR team advised the camp officials to transfer this group to other camps with available space.
- UNICEF provided 97,500 stationery sets and school bags to the Syrian students in 21 camps. Five schools in urban areas also receive the kits. UNICEF will also provide a container equipped with the necessary items to be used as rehabilitation center in Beydagi camp in Malatya.
