



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	<b>840,217</b>

## Highlights

- On 04 September, AFAD, the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Turkey's Government, announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in the 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220,751. AFAD reported that from 03 to 04 September, a total of 657 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 449 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Adiyaman, the number of Syrians accommodated in the waiting area is still over 100 persons. Despite some families have been admitted to the camp, there have been more new spontaneous arrivals. UNHCR team spoke to some of these new-arrivals, who stated to have come to Turkey from Aleppo via Kilis border through unofficial crossing points. One of the families (6 persons) claimed to have been in Viransehir previously and returned to Syria voluntarily but now came back and would like to be sent to Viransehir camp again. UNHCR team is following up with camp officials for their possible transfer.
- In Harran camp, officials informed that although some medicines are not included in the list of medicines covered by AFAD, when there is a special need in the camp, the management ensures that the medicines are provided. It requests the support of local authority who discusses with provincial AFAD. However in some provinces the officials are reluctant to cover the medicines which are not included in Health Implementation Communique of the Government.
- In Adana Saricam camp, the camp officials informed UNHCR that in several cases they had procured medicines with special prescriptions, but no beneficiaries approached the management to pick them up. A similar situation has also been reported by officials in Osmaniye camp. In Adana the doctors informed UNHCR that they will store these medicines and provide them to other refugees when they are in need.
- In Adana camp, the teacher of vocational training informed UNHCR that the students attending repairing classes of electrical items had repaired about 1,700 fans. The manager of the vocational course informed UNHCR that they are planning to organize a charity bazar to display the products and any income will be shared among the participants.
