



9. Humanitarian Aid is free

Humanitarian aid is free. You do not have to pay – not in money or goods, or by performing any kind of “favor” – to receive assistance. No one is allowed to ask you for anything in return for humanitarian assistance. If this happens, you have the right to make a complaint and if you choose, your identity will remain anonymous.

Key Questions

- Have you been asked or do you know someone who had to provide favors in return to getting assistance or aid?
- If yes, what kind of favors? And in your opinion or experience, do you think women and men are being asked for different kinds of favors?
- What would you do if you heard of someone asking for favors for aid or assistance?
- How do you think we can limit the risks of humanitarian staff asking for favors for in exchange for assistance?

10. Respect for diversity

All people are equal and have equal rights. Every person has the right to be treated with dignity and respect, and to live in safety and security. Nobody is allowed to discriminate against children based on their identity, nationality, disability, colour, ethnicity, religion, gender, language, health or economic background. Our culture, religion and traditions all tell us that we should offer protection, hospitality and respect to those in need.

Key Questions

- How do you think refugees are treated in your communities?
- Do you think refugee women, girls, boys and men are treated differently in your communities?
- Why differences are not accepted in some situations and some communities?
- How do you relate to people from different places?
