




## HIGHLIGHTS


In some areas of Lebanon, where cash assistance is not a feasible activity due to the absence of Automated Teller Machines (ATM) and the Syrian refugees had limited mobility, impeding them to reach the nearest ATM, UNICEF considered in-kind assistance instead of cash. Age-sized winter clothing kits were distributed to children below 15 years of age living in Informal Settlements (ISs) in Aarsal and Qaa in the Bekaa, and in Wadi Khaled and Akkar in Akkar. The assessment and distribution was performed by UNICEF partners SAWA and Concern Worldwide. A specific UNICEF Data Mobile Collection System (UniSupply) was used for the assessment and distribution, based on a unique identifier and barcode, providing a better accuracy for the kit sizes to be distributed to each household.



### Children benefited per Elevation


