

Support To Public Institutions in 2015 under the LCRP

In **2015**, more than **171.5** million USD of assistance was channeled to public institutions. **896** additional staff were provided to enhance their crisis response capacities within the LCRP. The support to public institutions in **2015** used national systems to provide assistance to refugees, but was primarily focused on supporting service delivery, enhancing capacities of public officials and civil servants, as well as policy development.

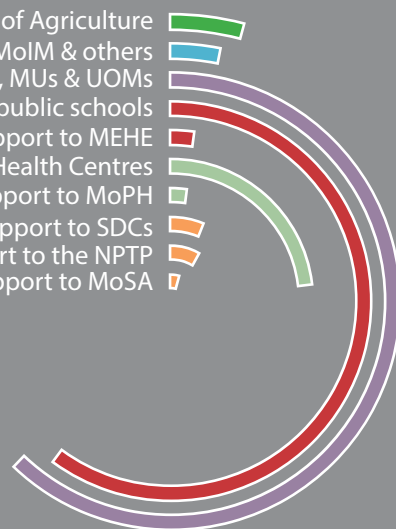
