### JULY HIGHLIGHTS:

**Dohuk**  
**Domiz Camp:** UNHCR Summarization distribution is on-going, based on needs assessments. EVIs that were not covered before and families with 8 members and above are considered; families with new born were also taken in consideration. 682 families/3,070 persons were covered in July by UNHCR. BRHA has provided 10 families/45 persons with 5 family tents to those whose tents were damaged as a result of fire-incident. UNHCR/Qandil provided 10 families/45 persons with NFIs. 712 hygiene kits were distributed through UNICEF/NRC in Domiz 1 camp, targeting 712 families/4,407 persons, the targeted beneficiaries were the extreme vulnerable families.  
**Gawilan camp:** UNHCR through Qandil distributed 45 full NFI kits for 45 families/168 individuals, including new arrivals, new marriage cases and relocation from urban. Additionally 97 family tents to 83 families/373 individuals (new arrival families) were provided. 37 blankets and 37 quilts were additionally provided to the family reunifications cases. PWJ through BCF distributed 400 air-coolers while BCF distributed extra 48 air-coolers targeting all families that didn't have air-coolers.

**Erbil:** Distribution of summer kits has been completed in camps and some of non-camps settings. Fires cases became a serious issue with the beginning of the heat season, more than 20 cases have been registered, 3 refugees were injured, tents and NFIs are destroyed. Scabies remain a serious problem in all the camps, 40 families affected have received a replacement of NFIs, including mattresses, blankets, hygiene kits.  
**Basirma camp:** Distribution of summer kits has been completed, in total 720 families have received summer kits during June and July, 2015. Additionally BCF distributed 100 Air Coolers for families and 8 Air coolers for the school.

**Kawergosk Camp:** NRC distributed 253 cleaning kits to identified households to support cleaning of communal showers and latrines. 59 summer kits have been provided. Scabies remains one of the main reasons for replacements of NFIs, not only in Kawergosk, but other camps as well. 7 families affected with scabies got NFIs replacements and 4 replacements for fire cases

**Darashakran Camp:** as a part of summer support a construction of shade area started on 30<sup>th</sup> July and it will take two weeks to finish. Following the opening of informal secondary school on 8th July, DRC has supported this community driven initiative by donating stationaries, 2 air coolers and electric cable for connection. Replacement of 18 CRI kits for scabies infection cases, and three fire cases.

**Qushtapa Camp:** IOM distributed vocational training tool kits to 11 individuals for tailoring, and motorbikes to 10 individuals. 15 families received NFIs replacements due to scabies.

**Sulaymaniyah, Arbat Camp:** opened the new section to accommodate 120 out of 256 long-term visitors who have been sharing tents of their relatives or were previously living outside of camp. Following the needs assessment UNHCR and YAO replaced CRIs for 328 families/1,070 persons including 16 new tents for the families residing in Arbat Refugee Camp since June 2014.

#### Anbar, Al-Obaidi Camp:

10, 650 liter of kerosene was distributed by UNHCR through ISHO during the month of July 2015. The number of families benefiting from this activity was 158 families. UNHCR through ISHO distributed 7,140 baby diapers, 4200 sanitary napkins, and 1430 adult diapers. UNHCR through ISHO released 7 CRI Kits to families who entered the camp during the month of July 2015.



### NEEDS ANALYSIS:

New scabies cases are continuously being referred. Due to the extreme temperature and frequent electricity outage in all of Sulaymaniyah, the Government has issued a new directive that Arbat Refugee Camp will share similar electricity shed as the rest of Arbat town. Improvement of shelters in Gawilan camp is a dire need before winter season as it was reported that 666 tents out of 924 were totally damaged by mold while 105 tents were moderately affected.
