The message has been integrated in the inter-sectorial advocacy messages to be discussed with Head of Agencies.</p> <p>Evaluation of the implementation of IASC GBV Guidelines 2005 Jordan, Lebanon, Iraq and Turkey (cross-borders) are part of the evaluation. In all countries Health sector will be evaluated, along with Shelter in Jordan and Lebanon, and Wash in Iraq and Turkey. The evaluation will be conducted by a consultant from June 14-19. SGBV SWG members will be contacted to participate in the evaluation.</p> <p>Field SWG and Task Forces During the last meeting of the Field CP/SGBV SWG in Zaatari the new co-coordinator, Nahla Kheiry, from IMC was selected.
