



**92,787** Syrian refugees are benefit from access to adequate quantity of safe water.

### JANUARY HIGHLIGHTS:

**Duhok:** The sector continued efforts to maintain and upgrade sanitation facilities for the 50,700 Syrians residing in **Domiz** camp (NRC and FRC).

**Erbil:** In **Qushtapa** camp, the construction of WASH facilities for 384 shelter plots (permanent side) has been completed and the relocation of refugee families from transit area to permanent side will take place in March. DRC continues supporting the effort of waste management and garbage disposal in Qushtapa.

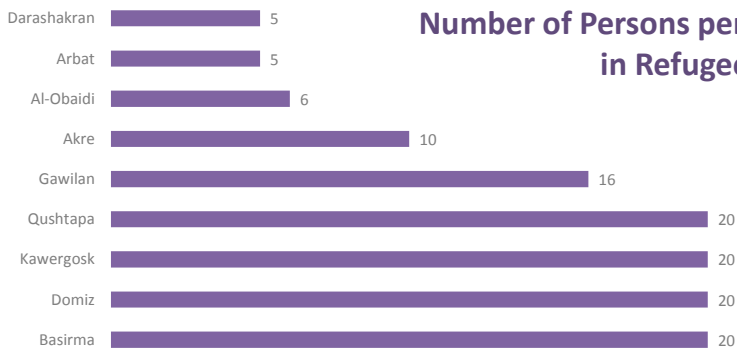
Following the completion of WASH facilities and other infrastructure in **Kawergosk** camp, refugee families will be relocated from transit area to permanent side starting in February 2015.

In **Basirma** camp, ACF continues their works in the sewage system in the area of concrete slabs of the western side of the camp. Camp clean-up was conducted on 15 January 2015 with the participation of the community and all actors inside camp.

ACF continues to maintain 58 latrines and 25 showers in **Darashakran** camp that were constructed for refugees from Kobane.

**Sulaymaniyah:** 1,280 refugees in Block C of the **Arbat** refugee camp in Sulaymaniyah have been benefited by the construction of a water pipeline jointly constructed by UNICEF and Qatar Red Crescent (QRC) a, which provides potable water and will reduce the risks of waterborne diseases. The project is in process of expansion to other blocks of Arbat refugee camp.

**Anbar: Al-Obaidi** camp is currently inaccessible due to the insecure situation in the Anbar province but the water provision was secured through the connection to the water pump station as reported last month.

### NEEDS ANALYSIS:

Funding for the continuation of operation and maintenance of the WASH facilities and the WASH services.

In Darashakran Camp (Erbil Governorate), the drainage of grey water continues to be an issue. UNICEF and additional camp actors are working to solve this concern by developing a grey water drainage system.

In Basirma Camp (Erbil Governorate), water quality remains a problem due to saline water in the borehole connected to the water network, partners will refer this to the Government for action.

In Arbat an extension of water trucking services and the installation of 5 water tanks (5000 litres) was needed.
