

Statistics/ Highlights

- **2,636** refugees and migrants arrived: **2,413** from fYRo Macedonia and **223** from Bulgaria.
- **952** departed to Croatia.
- **2,729** asylum seekers were registered on **26 November**, bringing the total to **474,131**.

The number of refugees arriving to Serbia picked up again but stayed manageable even in bad winter weather.

Serbia – fYRo Macedonia border

2,413 refugees and migrants were assisted at the Miratovac Refugee Aid Point (RAP) upon arrival from fYRo Macedonia. The weather was very cold at night and rainy during the day.

The police registered **2,566** asylum-seekers at the Reception Centre (RC) in Presevo.

The UNHCR/DRC van transported 4 families with persons with disabilities from the border to UNHCR-funded buses at Miratovac village. UNHCR, SCRM, Police, Medical centre, Red Cross, UNICEF, Caritas, DRC, UNFPA, Natan (IsrealAid) and Remar assisted asylum-seekers 24/7 at the Presevo RC. Police and Medical Centre provide assistance 24/7 at Miratovac RAP, UNHCR, IOM, DRC, Philanthropy and MSF, for security reasons, only during day time. Humedica provided medical services in Miratovac village from 7:00 am to 11:00 pm.

UNHCR and partners assisted over 48 persons with specific needs (PWSN), including 3 physically disabled and 2 pregnant women, and distributed 14 UNHCR blankets, 5 small bottles of water, 39 winter boots, 2 boxes of WFP HEB, 6 winter jackets and 1 wheelchair.

114 asylum-seekers frequented medical services inside the RC and the clinics of MSF/Humedica. The UNICEF/DRC child-friendly space hosted 38 mothers and 76 children.

Serbia – Bulgaria border

223 refugees and migrants arrived at Dimitrovgrad and Negotin, including 120 Afghans, with 8 women and 12 children, 100 Iraqi, with 15 women and 20 children and 3 Syrian men. Many were referred to doctors, mainly for respiratory infections, minor wounds and injuries.

Serbia- Belgrade

Around **90** refugees, mainly from Afghanistan, including 3 women and 10 children, were resting at any one time in parks and public areas in the city.

Serbia – Croatia border

952 asylum seekers departed to Croatia on board of one train from Sid station

UNHCR and HCIT fast tracked several PWSNs, assisted one case of family reunification, and distributed 366 water bottles, 11 UNHCR blankets, 300 WFP HEP biscuits, 10 UNHCR bags, 44 jackets, 21 pairs of boots, and 9 pairs of socks.

The SCRM, Red Cross, APC, Primary health facility doctors, police and Czech volunteers assisted asylum-seekers 24/7 at Adasevci RAP. BCM/CRS and MSF provided medical assistance. A child friendly space was managed by World Vision from 8 am to 8 pm.
