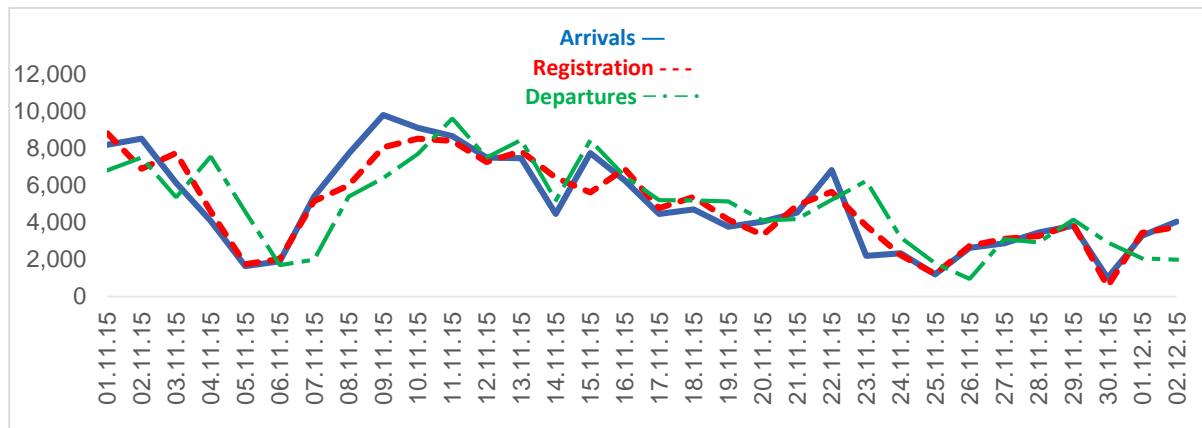


HIGHLIGHTS

Refugees and migrants arrived at average pace, including an increase in those arriving via Bulgaria. UNHCR and partners protected and assisted asylum-seekers 24 hours without major problems at all sites.

- **4,040** refugees and migrants arrived: **3,562** from fYRo Macedonia and **478** from Bulgaria.
- **1,982** asylum seekers departed to Croatia.
- **3,754** asylum seekers were registered on 02 December, bringing the total of asylum-requests during 2015 to **492,149**.



SOUTH

3,562 refugees and migrants were assisted at the Miratovac Refugee Aid Point (RAP) upon arrival from fYRo Macedonia.

The weather was cold at night and cloudy during the day.

150 asylum-seekers stayed the night in the RAP, waiting UNHCR funded buses to take them to registration at the Reception Centre (RC) in Presevo in the morning.

The UNHCR/DRC van transported eight persons with specific needs (PWSN), mainly physically disabled, from the new RAP site to the RC.

UNHCR-funded buses transported 1,400 asylum-seekers from Miratovac village to the RC.

The police registered **3,495** asylum-seekers at the RC, in a process that took only one hour on average.

UNHCR, SCRM, Police, Public Medical Services, Red Cross, UNICEF, Caritas, CARE International, DRC, Natan and Remar assisted asylum seekers 24/7 at the Presevo RC. UNFPA was present during the day. Police, IOM and Medical Centre assisted 24/7 at the Miratovac RAP, and UNHCR, DRC, Philanthropy and MSF, for security reasons, only 10:00 pm. Humedica provides medical services in Miratovac village from 7:00 am to 11:00 pm. MSF, Humedica, and ADRA got permission to work in the RC.

UNHCR and partners assisted over 56 Persons with Specific Needs (PWSN), including 24 physically disabled and one pregnant woman. UNHCR/ DRC distributed 5 UNHCR blankets, 70 winter boots, one winter jacket, 4 boxes of WFP HEB, 7 small bottles of water and one wheelchair.

60 asylum-seekers frequented medical services inside the RC and the clinics of MSF/Humedica/Natan. Two cases with severe medical conditions were referred to hospital, before they continued their onward travel.

The UNICEF/DRC child-friendly tent was dismantled. Awaiting set up of new winterized containers, 5 mothers and 20 children were placed in the Save the Children shelter outside the RC.

33 buses left Presevo for Sid, 659 asylum seekers took the train to Sid, Nis and Belgrade.

EAST

478 refugees and migrants arrived in Dimitrovgrad, Minicevo (Knjazevac) and Negotin. Among them, 442 were Afghans, including three children; 25 Iraqi, with 4 women and 7 children and 10 Syrians, including 3 women and four children, and one Somali.

Many needed winter clothes and shoes. The Medical Teams administered over 80 interventions, mainly for the respiratory infections, minor injuries and chronic illness.

The Red Cross, Sigma Plus, ADRA and Divac foundation distributed food, water and hygiene items. The Center for Social Work appointed relatives as temporary guardians to five identified unaccompanied and separated children.

BELGRADE

At any one time, over **175** refugees and migrants, rested in parks and public spaces.

SCRM, UNHCR/DRC, Red Cross, Asylum Info Center, Mikser and BCHR provided assistance and information. Those who needed winter clothes were escorted to the Asylum Info Centre or Miksalište. Sopot Community Health Centre and UNHCR doctors administered treatments in the park. The Red Cross distributed 269 meals. BCHR provided legal assistance and 47 refugees visited the Asylum Info Centre where they received information and hygiene packs, charged their phones and used the Internet.

WEST



1,982 asylum seekers departed to Croatia on board two trains.

The weather was dry and warmer than on previous days.

UNHCR/HCIT distributed 13 UNHCR Blankets, 852 Water bottles, 600 WFP HEBs, 65 UNHCR bags, 49 Jackets, 18 pair of boots and 33 pairs of socks.

UNHCR/HCIT assisted some 120 individuals with very small children board the train and one 55 year old Syrian woman on a wheelchair.

WAHA provided medical services to 34 asylum seekers at the train station, MSF and BCM to 250 and 55 asylum seekers respectively at the Adasevci RAP.

SCRM, UNHCR, Red Cross, Public health medical team, Ecumenic Humanitarian Organization, Intersos, APC, MSF, BCM, OM, CARE and Czech Volunteers assisted asylum seekers at Adasevci. The Red Cross provided food parcels. The UNICEF-funded child-friendly space hosted 25 children, with CZ volunteers staffing it. UNICEF donated 1,050 pairs of boots for children in different sizes. Intersos provided free Wi-Fi and phone charging. CARE are replacing the carpets in the of the Adasevci RAP lobby.
