



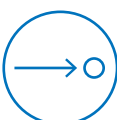
Arrivals and Departures: Over the weekend, the implementation of registration and screening procedures agreed upon through the Zagreb Joint Statement of the Heads of Police from the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Serbia, Croatia, Slovenia and Austria was organised, creating delays and restrictions based on nationality. In Greece, Afghan nationals were denied entry into the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, following the same procedure in Serbia. As of midday on 22 February, some 600 Afghan nationals are present in Eidomeni. UNHCR is discussing solutions with authorities related to the group of Afghan nationals currently present in Tabanovce. In addition, people without personal identification documents (passports, IDs, birth or marriage certificates) in addition to the Greek police note, were denied entry into the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia.

Condition of People: With the growing numbers of child deaths at sea, UNHCR, UNICEF and IOM issued a [call](#) for the enhanced safety of refugees and migrants. An average of two children have drowned every day since September 2015 as their families try to cross the eastern Mediterranean, and the number of child deaths is growing. Since last September, more than 340 children, many of them

babies and toddlers, have drowned in the eastern Mediterranean. The total number of children who have died may be even greater.

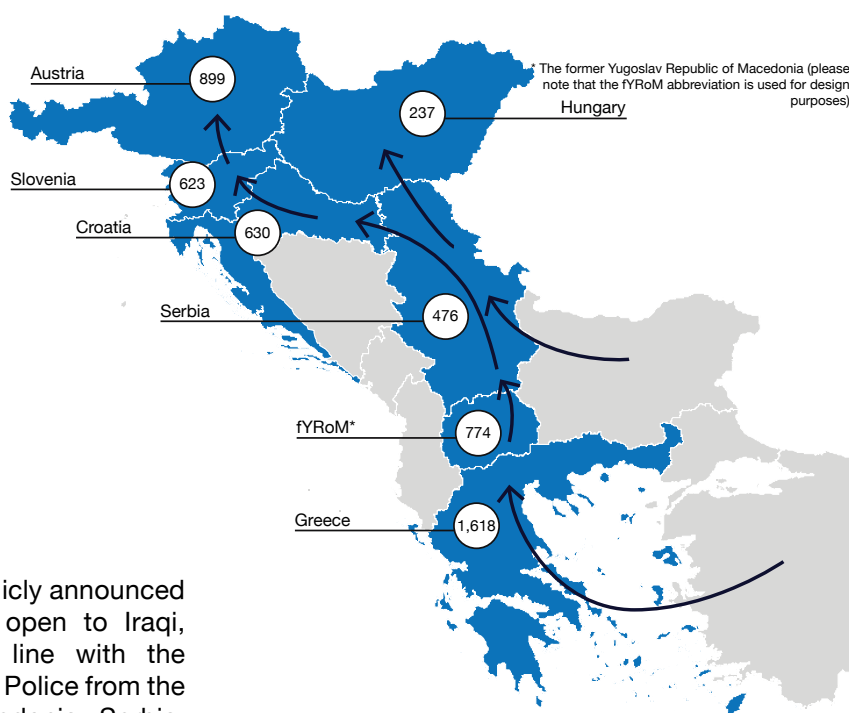
In Serbia, the Sid Refugee Aid Point was overcrowded and boarding of trains to Croatia delayed due to new verification procedures. In addition to other measures agreed upon jointly by the Chiefs of Police, according to border police in Dimitrovgrad, only Iraqi and Syrian women and children will be registered. Men and Afghan nationals, regardless of age or gender, will not be registered. UNHCR has requested official confirmation of new policy implementation guidelines. 200 refugees and migrants, who were previously not allowed entry into Croatia, walked from the reception centre in Sid towards the Croatian border in an attempt to cross the border on foot. Serbian authorities organized buses to transport them back to the Principovac RAP.

Deaths at Sea: On Chios, a 2 year old Afghan boy was found dead on arrival at the beach on the evening of 20 February. The child's mother reportedly became separated from other family members as smugglers were forcing passengers onto an overcrowded boat, and was unaware that he was also on the boat until arrival on Chios. This is the second such incident on Chios within the same week. The cause of the child's death has not yet been determined.

Critical Developments

The Serbian Minister of Labour publicly announced that the Serbian borders remain open to Iraqi, Afghan and Syrian nationals in line with the agreement made between Heads of Police from the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Serbia, Croatia, Slovenia and Austria. Entry is forbidden for Moroccans, Algerians, Libyans and numerous other nations from countries deemed as not war affected.

While the daily limit of 80 asylum applications has not yet been reached, the Austrian Minister of Interior already announced the further lowering of this limit in the future. In addition to the 1,000

soldiers already providing support in managing the refugee situation, another 450 soldiers will be deployed to the borders to assist the police. The Austrian Minister of Interior and Austrian Minister for Foreign Affairs invited authorities from Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Kosovo, Croatia, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia and Slovenia to a Conference on "Managing Migration Together" on 24 February in Vienna.

On 21 February, the Greek Alternate Minister of Citizens' Protection, stated that NATO's main mission in the Aegean will be monitoring and notifying Frontex, of Turkey adhering to the

agreement of limiting human smuggling at sea and that NATO will not be involved in the identification process or in push-backs.

Weather Headlines

- Temperatures will be higher than average until mid-week and it will feel mild, particularly in Greece and the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia.
- There will be strong southerly winds developing on Wednesday in the Aegean with waves becoming moderate or rough for a time between the Islands and Turkey.

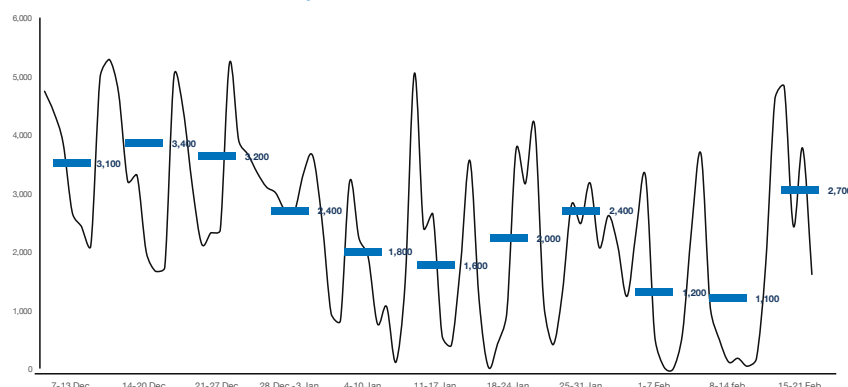

Key locations crossed by refugees



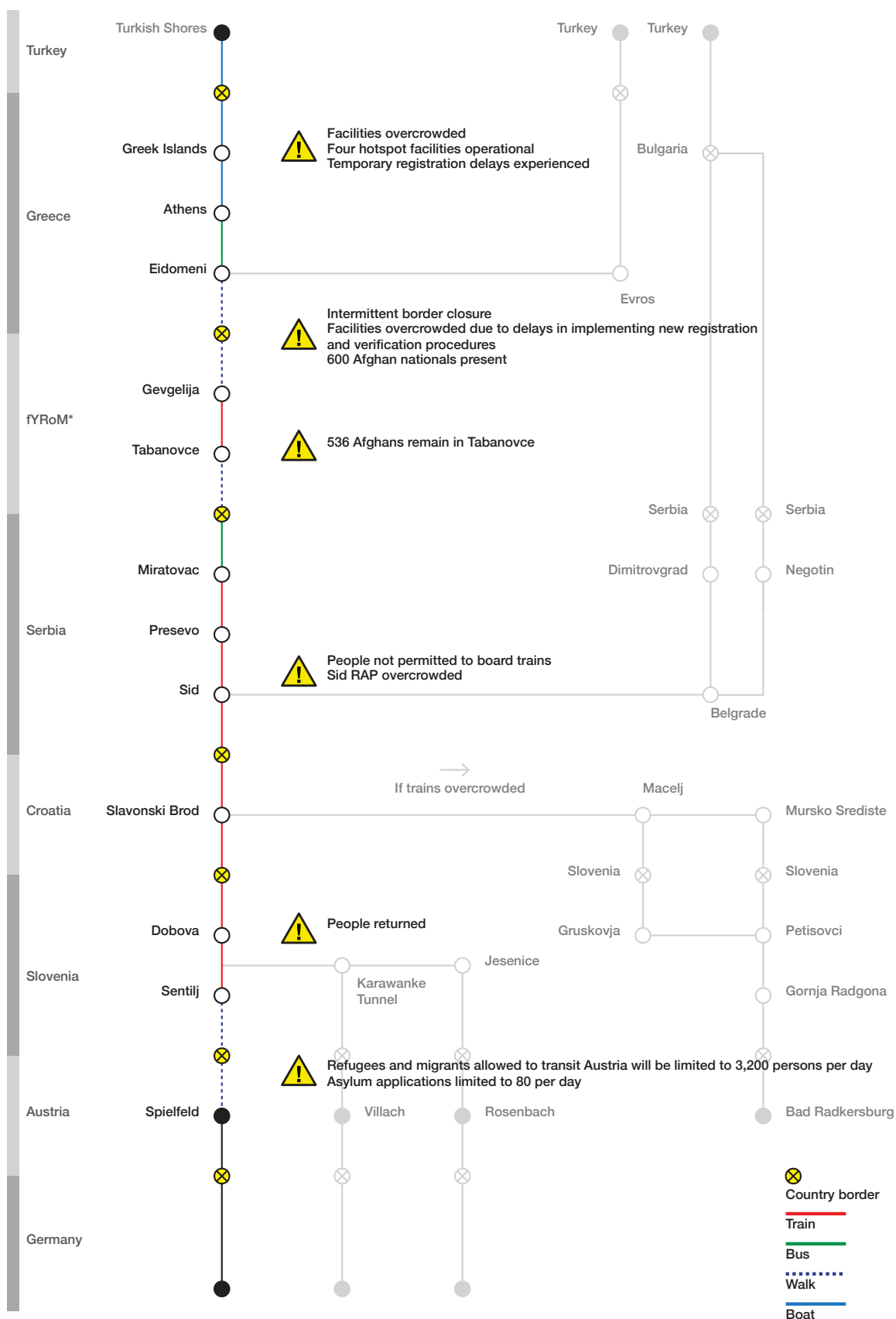
Weather Assessment

- Mainly settled across the region this week however there will be some periods of unsettled weather, particularly on Wednesday when there will be a period of strong southerly winds in the Aegean. Some moderate or large waves are expected to build between Turkey and the Islands. Previous analysis has shown that the number of arrivals to the Greek Island reduces in these conditions. The strong winds will not last long and the waves are expected to reduce later on Wednesday night.
- Once again it is very mild across SE Europe at the beginning of the week. Temperatures are higher than average for the time of year everywhere with possible exception to northern Slovenia and Austria. Colder air will move south for a time later in the week with minimum temperatures below freezing and the potential for some snow. This will come as a shock after the mild conditions with potential for people to suffer cold-related illness if they are unprepared.

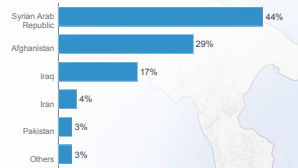

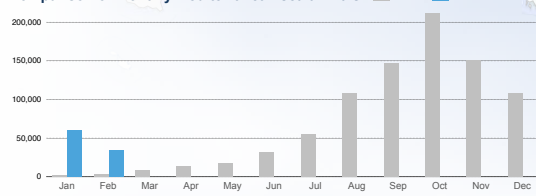

MONTHLY SOCIAL MEDIA ACTIVITY ANALYSIS

In analysing the trend of conversations on Twitter surrounding the refugee crisis and Syrian refugees, there have been consistent troughs and peaks since 17 January 2016.

The most significant peak in individual tweets using #SyrianRefugees was observed on 1 February, a possible coincidence with the International Military Review of the Syria-Iraq battlespace, as well as talks on NATO's intervention in initiatives to prevent illegal sea crossings into Europe.

Statistics for #NATO, in correlation to #SyrianRefugees, also exhibited a sharp rise in social media activity particularly on 2 February with an average of 3,200 individual tweets and 4,900 retweets. This can also be compared to Twitter activity of #Syria which showed an extremely sharp rise in retweets (63,500) since 17 January. Figures for 15 February were not far off: 18,300 individual tweets, 58,000 retweets, and 11,270 impressions.
