



Medical and psychosocial services for migrants and refugees who have suffered torture and other forms of violence

Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF) offer medical care and psychosocial support to migrants and refugees who have suffered systematic violence in their country of origin, during the journey or during their stay in Greece.

In particular for survivors of torture, MSF works in close collaboration with the Prometheus II project¹ implemented by the Greek Council for Refugees and BABEL Day Center. Within this framework legal aid, support for international protection requests, integration services and services of psychological, social, and psychiatric assistance are offered to survivors of torture.

MSF action aims at assisting survivors cope with medical problems resulting from any sort of violence – except for domestic violence. To this end the following services are offered directly or through referrals:

- Medical assessment by the MSF medical doctors and referrals as needed for diagnostics and specialists consultations.
- Management of chronic health problems which are related to the violence, aiming at rehabilitation.
- Physiotherapy.
- Psychological support.
- Social support.
- Orientation and facilitation (accompaniments, interpretation) for the use of the healthcare system.
