HIGHLIGHTS

- 2,700 IDPs including **2,000 women** learned about their rights in elections
- A **stronger protection network** is being built in North East states through IDP training in Bauchi
- 300 protection monitors** from 10 northern states are jointly trained by UNHCR and National Human Rights commission
- NFIs for **13,000 families** are pre-positioned and ready to be distributed in Gombe State

PRIORITIES

- Conduct trainings to **strengthen the capacity** of partners, stakeholders and IDPs to prevent, address and respond to pressing protection concerns
- Advocate** for a comprehensive IDP policy and IDP legislative framework in Nigeria to build a better IDP protection environment
- Carry out **protection monitoring** to better identify and respond to protection issues
- Co-lead the **Protection Sector Working Group** with the National Human Rights Commission and roll out state-level PSWGs to coordinate protection activities to respond to the humanitarian crisis in northern Nigeria



Institute for Peace and Conflict Resolution, UNHCR's implementing partner, conducted sensitizations on voter rights and obligations to IDPs in two camps in Adamawa State

UNHCR conducted training on IDP protection targeting 35 participants, including Government stakeholders, faith and community leaders, national NGOs, and teachers from four conflict-affected states in the North East

UNHCR and NHRC jointly held training sessions for protection monitors who will monitor individual and community level protection incidents and risks in North East and North Central states



UNHCR organized a training for 8 partners on cash transfer programming in emergencies
