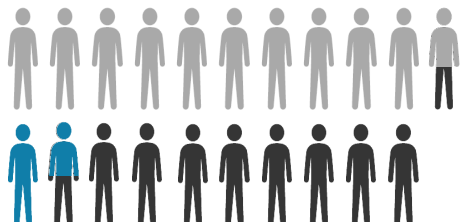

HIGHLIGHTS

- After the recent attacks in Diffa region, UNHCR, after consultations with authorities, decided that both Sayam Forage and Kablewa camps shall be open to all the displaced population (Nigerian refugees and Niger returnees).
- Niger authorities ordered the Lake Chad islands located in the South East of N'Guigmi Department to be evacuated in order to proceed with military operations in the fight against the Boko Haram.
- The presence of landmines along the border around Komadougou is still preventing access to certain areas.
- A significant number of detentions are taking place in Diffa region. UNHCR is monitoring detentions of persons of concern and will provide legal assistance.

PRIORITIES

- Regaining access to certain areas. The security situation still prevents humanitarian actors to assist the displaced population.
- The relocation process to Sayam Forage refugee camp which was stopped after the attacks is now re-starting.
- Construction and/or rehabilitation of shelters.



Under the supervision of the protection cluster coordinator, discussion are underway, with all actors, to come up with a collective strategy and a harmonized approach in the Diffa response.



Diffa was not affected by the meningitis epidemic and no cases were recorded in Sayam Forage. MSF set up a mobile clinic to provide basic care and also carried out vaccination to new born and pregnant women.



The United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) has welcomed in-kind and cash donations from USAID (US\$40 million) to support WFP's assistance to very poor households including more than 60,000 Nigerian refugees with life-saving food after they had fled violence in northern Nigeria.



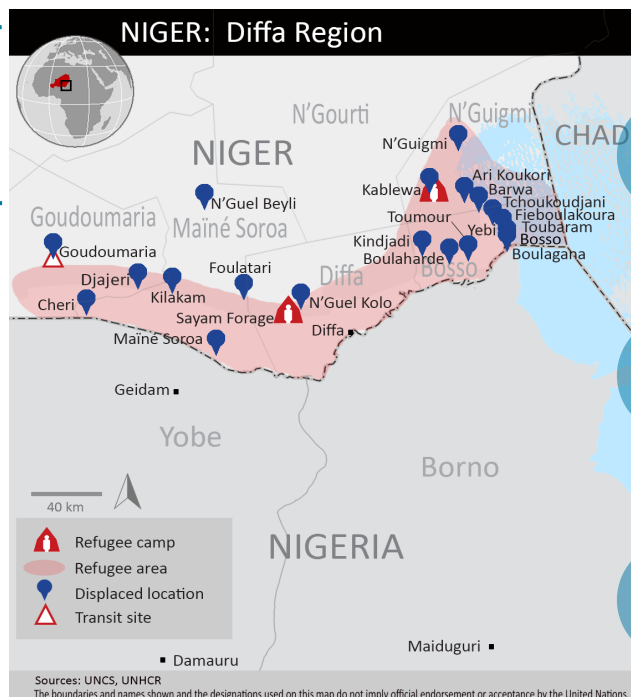
Care International is continuing its water trucking activity with a UNHCR tanker truck of 16 000L capacity. The extraction is done through a private forage in Sayam distributing 16 ,000l/d in the camp.



UNHCR launched an urbanization program in Maine Soroa benefiting a first batch of a thousand displaced people. UNHCR and Plan International have signed a Letter of Understanding in order to build 1,000 shelters out of camp in the Diffa region.



Distance learning centers have re-opened and teachers and pupils are slowly coming back. The distance learning education program has been suspended after the February attacks.
