

UNHCR operational highlights

- On 8 December, UNHCR Regional Representative accompanied the Humanitarian Coordinator in DRC on a mission in Goma. With other UN Agencies Representatives they visited Mugunga 3 IDP camp, expressed the humanitarian community's support to the IDPs, and humanitarian actors as well, and discussed with them how to provide critical humanitarian assistance and better protection conditions.
- On 11 December, UNHCR and implementing partners Lutherian World Federation (LWF) and Diakonie initiated a « Go and see visit » to give to those IDPs who would like to return to their villages of origin the possibility to assess the security conditions in the return areas prior to making their final decision to return. The delegation visited 12 villages.
- On 12 December, a fixing operation was conducted in the Mugunga 3 IDP camp. It is important to note that Mugunga 3 IDP camp hosted 1,140 newly displaced households transferred from the Don Bosco site. The installation of all new households has been completed. Another fixing operation was conducted by the RRMP in spontaneous sites.



Working with partners

Together with the DRC Government authorities, in particular the National Commission for Refugees (CNR), UNHCR manages and implements humanitarian assistance and protection for refugees, returnees and internally displaced persons. Within the collaborative approach, support is delivered jointly with MONUSCO, WFP, UNICEF, OCHA, UNDP, UNFPA, WHO, FAO, UNOPS and IOM among other agencies and NGOs. UNHCR leads the Protection cluster and with UNDP co-leads the Early Recovery cluster. UNHCR is also the lead of the Protection and Prevention component of the Comprehensive Strategy to Combating SGBV in DRC, under the STAREC.

In the field, assistance is delivered together with 30 implementing partners: ACF, ADRA, ADSSE, AIDES, AIRD, ARAL, CAMPS, CARITAS, CDI BWAMANDA, CIP, CNR, ERUKIN, FEMISA, GRACE, HOPE, IEADA, INTERSOS, LES AIGLONS, LWF, MAAS, MEDAIR, OIM, OXFAM, PLD, PU, SAVE THE CHILDREN, SFCG, UNOPS, WFWI, WHH.



Achievements

- Since January 1st, some **10,780** Rwandan refugees returned to Rwanda of which **2,803** from Bukavu, **7,970** from Goma and **7** from Kasai Oriental.
- Some 483 Burundian refugees returned to Burundi since the beginning of this year.
- 17,111 Angolan Refugees have been repatriated during the operation started on 4 November 2011 and ended on 30 June 2012. This year, UNHCR facilitated the repatriation of 15,573 Angolan refugees of which 7,316 from Bas-Congo, 1,798 from Katanga and 6,459 from Kinshasa.
- 46,318 DRC refugees returned from Republic of Congo to Equateur Province since the launch of the voluntary repatriation operation on 5 May.
- 256 Congolese refugees have been repatriated from Burundi this year.
- Since the beginning of this year 66 Congolese refugees have been repatriated from Tanzania.
