
Barriers to participation in the labor force amongst male and female youth:

- Men: expectations do not match qualifications; role of wasta; results in discouragement to the extent that there is 1% year-on-year decrease in economically active male youth
- Women: 3rd lowest rates of labor force participation in MENA; primarily cultural reasons but due to economy more women entering the labor force becoming more acceptable
- Women and youth do not have the necessary skill sets to enable them to enter the labor force
- Business owners do not fully apply labor laws and regulations

How will we respond:

- Engage community leaders on women's participation in the labor force
- Personal development training for male and female youth
- Job matching for VT graduates and unemployed men and women – in line with experience and managing expectations
- Ethics training for business owners

Services to be provided and methodology



Local Economic Development

- > Inclusive participation of communities in municipal decision-making is a key driver for establishing the conditions for durable LED solutions.
 - > Create collaborative platforms involving **multiple stakeholders** that produce a tangible understanding of opportunities and challenges facing their local economies;
 - > These will **build on** participatory planning cycles and **established community groups**.
 - > Improve practices, strategies, and stakeholders' relationships to accommodate **collective problem solving**.
 - > Provide the tangible opportunity to **create consensus and ownership** over a priority investment project.

Focus- Dialogue Tables

- > Platform for community collaboration and engagement.
 - > Serve as a fora to tackle barriers faced by the private sector
 - > Validate research findings including market analysis and skills mapping
 - > Identify small-scale infrastructure and public service needs that will support increased economic activity and quality service delivery.
- > Dialogue tables will be complemented by working groups organized on an ‘as needed’ basis
 - > Separate working groups for women, refugees, and youth.

Activity description

Direct investments to tackle service delivery and infrastructure gaps prioritised with the private sector and communities

Purpose

- Provide income-generating opportunities for MSMEs
- Create temporary employment opportunities for job seekers
- Improve the economic enabling environment through increased access to services and markets
- Address key constraints in individuals (particularly youth, women and marginalised individuals) access to employment opportunities
 - Provision of childcare arrangements
 - Upgrading of work environments to enable female participation
