#### • General/UNICEF:

- 1. Eid plans: Eid is expected to last for almost a week and WASH sector partners are requested to
- Make all the necessary plans to ensure that activities continue without interruption during the holidays
- All partners share contact details of staff/focal point that will be available on call to support operations during the holiday if need be. (details to be shared by COB 8<sup>th</sup> September)
- All partners to support with WASH needs that may arise from animal slaughtering during Eid at the agreed designated locations; including site cleaning after the slaughter. Based on previous years' experience, no extra water will be required for this but if needed, partners can support. Partners will monitor the situation and act accordingly.

## 2. WASH winter plans

- Partners reminded to share contact details of focal points during for the winter response.
- Partners also requested to assess their contingency stock and resources, mobilize and use the stock planned for water strikes and inform UNICEF of additional needs for resources to ensure effective response during the next storm
- Partners are requested to ensure that proper reinstatement is done by the contractors or teams for all construction works undertakes; to facilitate access to WASH services during the winter period.
- UNICEF to update the plan and contact partners bilaterally to follow up on specific action points

## 3. Water level dropping in the internal wells

- UNICEF is monitoring and logging water levels in the wells, and observed a general drop in the water table in one of the three wells in Zaatari camp
- This will require a reduction in the water production in the camp, and consequently a reduction in the supply/consumption in the camp
- The WASH sector will conduct assessment on the water needs and consumption patterns of institutions and agencies in the camp and will readjust where possible

	Movement of refugees in the camp				
	- The WASH sector is particularly concerned with the movement of refugees in the camp and the subsequent requests for WASH services				
	- As the WASH infrastructural projects' aim to foster permanency in the camp;				
	<ul> <li>Refugees who UNOFFICIALLY move from one location of the camp to another will not be supported with both wastewater connection and private toilet except in extraordinary situations and for very justified reasons. This will have to be discussed and agreed on a case by case basis after detailed technical feasibility assessment.</li> <li>All UNHCR planned and facilitated movement to be discussed with WASH sector prior to the movement. This will be to ensure that a connection of the new shelter to the wastewater network is feasible and will not cause operational issues for the network as a whole. The WASH sector preference is to move refugees in existing and already connected vacant shelters where feasible.</li> </ul>
