- **What?**

- 'Adaptation of urban water service providers to increased demand in supply and/or affected systems due to crises'

- **Where?**

- Middle East and North Africa region
- 2 case studies: Jordan and Lebanon

- **Why? Fill information gaps!**
 - Evidence building and analysis
 - Increase knowledge in emergency urban water service
 - Improve water programming
- **When?**
 - September 2016 – March 2017

- Desk-based research

1. Identify different adaptation experiences
2. Analyse what has worked well and barriers
3. Make recommendations

Research question:

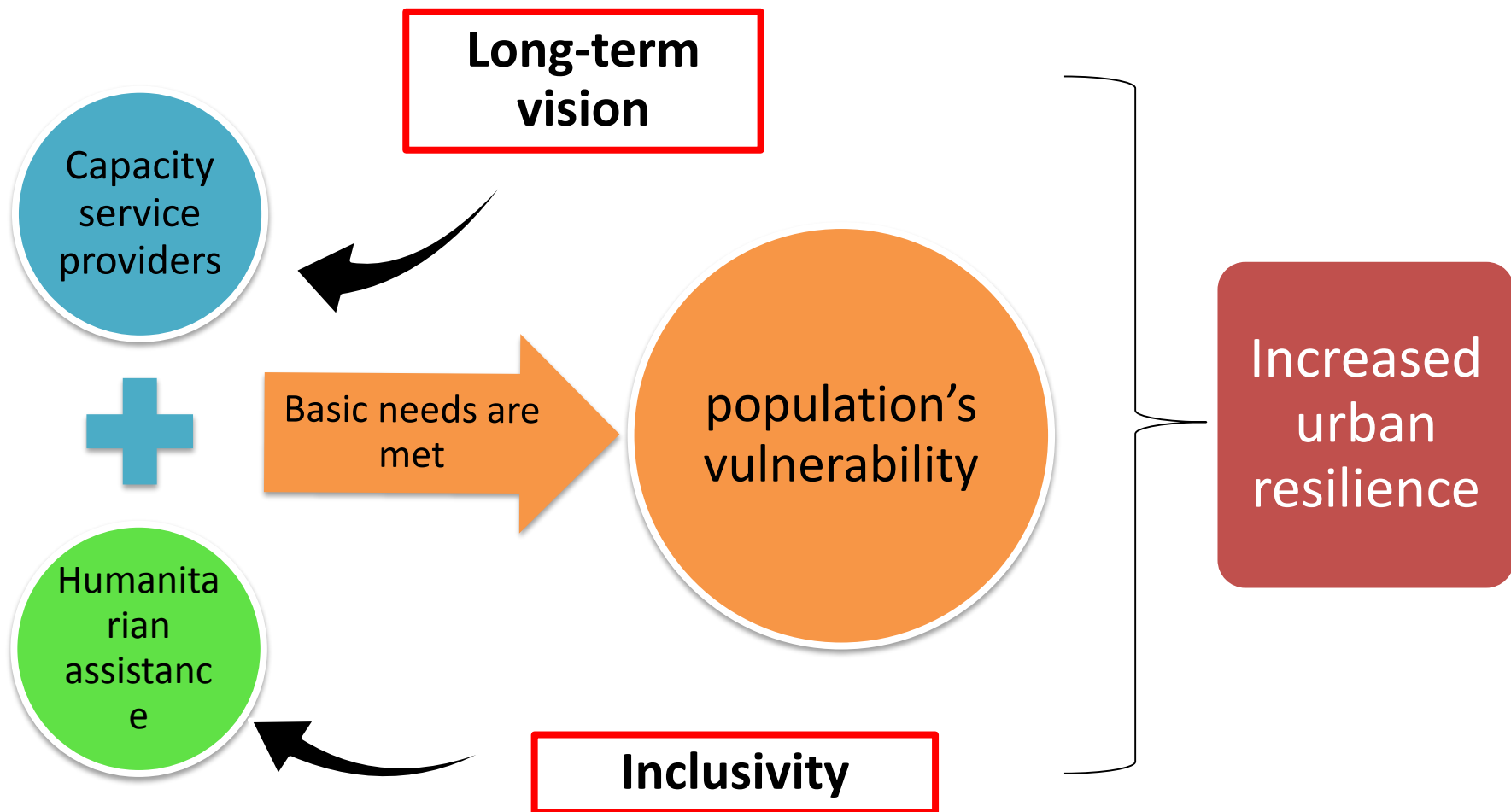
*‘To what extent have service providers been able to **respond to changes in water demand and/or disruption** to supply systems resulting from **crises** in the MENA region?’*
