1. Updates	Network for Children's Rights: Works with SC in Elliniko and Schisto. They have	-
from	education classes for adolescents at Larisa Station. They sent staff to support children	
Partners	from Schisto in their first days of beginning classes in the formal school of Perama.	
	• SIF: In Malakasa the registration of children for formal schools is running smoothly. They	
	will be providing homework support for the school-going children in the mornings from	
	09:30 to 12:30. SIF have arranged visits to local schools for children living in Malakasa	
	and have brought Greek children from local schools to Malakasa to support the	
	integration and interaction between the two groups of children.	
	• ELIX: Operating programmes in central Athens (Akominatou str., Vathis Square). On	
	Monday (6/2) they will start also at a school at Kanigkos square. They plan to open	
	programmes at one more school. They need to include the UAC of Elaionas camp into	
	their plans. Their classes (based in formal schools) run from 16.00-20.00. They plan to	
	reach 800 children living in urban Athens and 300 parents with classes.	
	• Lambrakis Foundation: They continue their work in Rafina. This includes Greek lessons	
	for women and educational activities with preschool children. Communication with KAPI	
	of Rafina, for cooperation in common activities with beneficiaries. There have been a	
	few coordination challenges at the site which were exacerbated by poor weather	
	conditions and problems with heating. Staff in the site were asked to use toilets outside	
	of the camp.	
	• Save the Children: Continuation of programmes in Malakasa, Skaramangas and Schisto.	
	Enrolment in Eleniko I and III, with the start of classes on Friday 10 <sup>th</sup> .	
	• UNHCR: No comments. Would like to listen other NGOs feedback. They asked ELIX for	
	clarifications about their urban school programme.	

	<ul> <li>Ministry of Migration Policy: There are no major updates from the Ministry of Migration Policy. The MoMPo visited Rafina, to help resolve coordination issues at the site. Things seem to have improved. The MoMPo will be continuing to visit all sites and to support the transition into formal schooling.</li> </ul>

3. 4Ws	The national Education Working Group will be rolling out a new system for reporting. This is likely to be on a monthly basis and is in addition to Activity Info.	Waiting for the 4W to be circulated by the national Working Group.
