


In March 2017, UNHCR continued to provide counselling on legal and administrative issues for Syrian refugees. As a result, 14 cases were referred to UNHCR's legal partner for legal assistance.

Between January and March 9,652 children, adolescents and youth were assisted with structured and sustained PSS services offered by all 3RP Partners. In March, 274 children, adolescents and youth were assisted by Save the Children (SCI) and PSTIC/Tdh offered across Greater Cairo and Alexandria. 86% of beneficiaries were aged 10-17 years. 36% were youth and adolescents aged 18-24 years. In addition, Tdh operating in Greater Cairo and Alexandria extended PSS services to 3,396 children, adolescents and youth. In March, 9 children newly benefitted from SCI's multi-sectoral case management, 89% of which are boys.

14 Syrian SGBV survivors were identified by UNHCR Egypt's offices in Cairo and Alexandria either directly or via partners, including six women, seven girls, and one boy. A total of 138 Syrian refugees approached to UNHCR partner CARE's Women Friendly Space in 6th of October City in order to attend art and sports classes, awareness sessions and
