<b>CCCM</b> Agency – RSG, UNHCR, LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Regular CMC meeting was held on 12 October and participated by 36 (15 women) representatives from CMC, social groups and camp based committees and discussed on camp level issues - NFI, health, livelihood, shelter and WASH, Education and Food.</li> <li>Inter-agency meeting was held on 22 October and participated by 35 (15 Women) representatives from CMC, YDG, CDG, WDG and LWF. Discussed about camp level issue food, Shelter, NFI, Livelihood and Walkway.</li> <li>Visibility Kits (umbrella and shoes) distributed on 26 October for 30 CMC (15 women) and only shoes for Incentive worker 9 (3 women).</li> <li>Conducted CMC capacity development training on 26 October attended by 35 (15 women).</li> <li>During the month LWF and CMC installed bill boards with information of service providers and effective camp management. Similarly repaired CMC block, provided stationaries and furniture for smooth CMC operation and provide CMC services to camp dwellers. .</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Camp population and food entitle population is different and CMC requesting to update entitlement list.</li> <li>Inadequate ownership of the camp infrastructure (toilet, fire points, bill boards etc) causing many problems.</li> <li>High level of dependency, inadequate community security mechanism, lack of accountability are the issues need to be improve in the camp.</li> </ul>
<b>Education</b> Agency - LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>4 TLSs and 1 NFE centres are running smoothly by 16 (2 women) TLS teacher and 2 NFE facilitators. 717 (214-girl) students are in grade 1 to 5.</li> <li>Rain coat distributed on 6 October for 16 TLS teacher (2-female) and 2 NFE teachers.</li> <li>4 TLS renovation is under progress.</li> <li>LWF facilitate to DEO to conduct grade 5 examination for 12 students on 22 October.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>CMC and PTA request to renovate school latrine.</li> </ul>
<b>Food and Nutrition</b> Agency – SCI and ACF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>4,032 populations of 1,011 families received one month food ration from SCI on 30<sup>th</sup> September.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>IDP population and food entitled population is different So CMC requested to update food entitle list and provide food since long time.</li> </ul>

<b>NFIs</b> Agency: UNHCR, ICRC	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>ICRC distributed cooking fuel/charcoal 2 bags per family 9 October.</li> <li>LWF and UNHCR have a plan to provide NFI kits.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>CMC/WDG requested to provide touch light or solar light for to read their Child.</li> </ul>

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<b>Shelter and camp infrastructure</b> Agency – RSG, UNHCR, LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 76 long houses and 629 rooms repaired by LWF.</li> <li>• 21 long house construction tender is awarded by LWF and work will be initiated soon.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC and IDPs requested to renovate all damaged rooms, collapsed, leaning shelters and CMC block.</li> </ul>
<b>WASH</b> Agency - SI	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Most of the latrines are not functional in the camps. SI has a plan to renovate soon</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lack of ownership feeling, misuse/careless of public structure materials were observed in the camp.</li> </ul>
<b>Protection and Community Service:</b> Agency – LWF, DRC, SCI	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Supplied newspaper and magazine regularly during the month. 110 (25 women and girl) visited libraries and studied reading materials as their interest. With aiming to provide appropriate reading environment, LWF provided furniture (1 table, 2 book shelf and 4 shares) for the library.</li> <li>• 10 women participants receiving tailoring/dress making training.</li> <li>• Conducted indoor recreational activities (painting, knit) on 2nd October.</li> </ul>
