Camp Coordination and Camp Management Agency- Lutheran World Federation (LWF)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Shwe Tha Ha (local NGO) conducted a conflict resolution Training on 10th June. There were 24 (5 female) from CMC, WDG and IDPs. CMC meeting conducted on 15th June and it was participated by 34 (15 women) CMC members and representatives from WDG, YDG, Disable persons, FMCs, Elderly, PTAs and Camp Incentive Workers. IDPs and camp management issues were discussed. Inter-agency meeting was conducted on 29th June and attended by 34 (16 women) representatives from CMC, WDG, YDG, and Disable persons, DRC, CDN and LWF. The agencies shared previous month progress, responded concerns and shared next month plan There are 81 (37 women) people with specific needs, 196 pregnant women and 328 lactating mother. There are 20 (9 women) new born babies and 6 (3 women) death case during the month and updated population. LWF received 3 (WFP, Plan and LWF/UNHCR) complain letters, but three letters are the same and about food LWF already sent to concern agencies to take necessary actions on 29th June. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> IWs and CMC requested to support the visibility kits (umbrella and Shoes and rain coat) because of rainy season.
