The distribution will cover more than 10,000 households. It is planned that this distribution will start after the HH survey ends.

The courses will take place every week at the Women Center. - General information sessions, and focus group discussions and all other activities are on-going.
Protection DRC	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Focal point trainings with the new women's group facilitators and new guards; - Protection Team will continue working with PSNs in the camps and following up on them; - Training for women's group facilitators on Protection and Code of Conduct in STMG and PYG; - Regular protection activities on-going.
Child Protection DRC	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A meeting with Child Protection Group and Youth Facilitators is scheduled on April 27 and 30 at the Youth Centre; - IPA distribution on April 28-30 at the Youth Center.
Security and Safety	<p>It was reported during a meeting with women's group that there have been cases of chicken pox in PYG village, STMG camp, and also in OTG-N where 18 cases were confirmed by Mercy Malaysia. The Clinics in the camps have been informed as well as protection partners, however if you have further information, please contact CCCM or Protection partners.</p>
