Camp Coordination and Camp Management Agency - RSG, UNHCR and LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CMCs meeting held on 7 April and participated by 35 (18 women) representatives from CMCs, incentive workers and camp based committees. The meeting discussed about for newly born for food ration, Health services, Education, WASH, Fire safety and DRR, Community Service, Nutrition, Shelter and block system. LWF Regional Representative Mr.David with 3 donor visitors visited and observed camp activity on camp 7 April. Inter-Agency coordination meeting held on 28 April, attended by 39 (17 woman) representative from CMCs, SDGs, Elderly, ACF, Department of Agriculture, SI, Plan and discussed about WASH, Food and Nutrition, Shelter, Education. 1 incentive worker recruited, shared about block system. In order to communication and coordination, CMCs leader and IWI received top up card from LWF CCCM Focal person. 18 (12 women) IDPs died from the camp by boat accident on 19 April. Rakhaine State Government provided MMK 2 lakhs f affected families. During the month 1 IDPs woman dead for TB fever on 18 April. 12 (7 girls) new baby born during the month and population updated. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CMCs request to provide tarpaulin before rain to protect family IDP claimed that 4 families could not receive compensation cost MMK 2 Lakhs who lost their member in boat accident.
