Sector	Updates	Key Concerns
Camp Coordination and Camp Management Agency - RSG, UNHCR and LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CMC meeting was held on 14th January and participated by 51 (16 Women) representatives from CMC, incentive workers and camp based committees. The meeting discussed about food ration, health services and education. WFP visited the camp and discussed about food distribution plan with CMCs on 20th January. Camp Level Inter-Agency Coordination Meeting was held on 28th January and participated by 58 (21 women) representatives from Plan, SI, SCI, CMC, FMC, LWF, ACF Incentive Workers, and camp based committees. In the meeting agencies updated their activities and discussed on concerns of agencies and community. LWF also did its activity social audit in same meeting and presented camp level activities in completed in 2015. LWF CCCM supported communication and coordination cost to CMC and Incentive Worker In-Charge for the month. 19 (7 women) IWs including IW in charge, were extended 6 months contract by LWF, CCCM. HH verification survey were conducted during the month and verified by CMCs and IWs. Data entry work in progress. LWF consulted with CMC to prepare family profile. 7 (3 girls) babies were born during the month and updated population dashboard. IWI updated activity dashboard during the month. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> During feedback session of social audit CMC and SI appreciate LWF role of facilitation and suggested to label on tent. Plan appreciates women participation in camp level meeting and suggested to make it meaningful. LWF Focal person briefed about Social Audit and its message regarding transparency, accountability and building trust. During IA meeting CMC and SI discussed about ownership of the WASH structure and take care by community. CMC requested to support CMC office in same location but due to crowd LWF suggested to identify appropriate location.
