<b>Camp Coordination and Camp Management</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>LWF conducted family survey in the month to verify population changes in the camps.</li> <li>Oxfam staff and CMC members had a meeting for DRR activity on 17 November. Similarly, Government Department of Health had a meeting to find camp requirements and fire safety on 24 November.</li> <li>Organized Inter agency meeting on 26th November where 48 (22 Female) representatives from CMC, IRC, CDN, ACF, SCI and LWF were participated and discussed on camp issues.</li> <li>CMC organized monthly meeting and discussed on camp issues in presence of women and youth group representatives.</li> <li>There are 4 (3 female) new born babies in the month of November.</li> <li>2 IDPs deaths were reported.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Inadequate collective efforts to provide service and assistance.</li> <li>CMC and women representatives raised progress on sewing training.</li> <li>IDP and CMC requested to provide winter cloth and blankets.</li> </ul>
<b>Education</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In the camp, Save the Children international (SCI) is supporting for 3 TLS and assigned 15 volunteer teachers.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Among 15 teachers; 5 are paid by Government, 5 are paid Incentive Workers and 5 are unpaid volunteers. The 5 frequently ask for remuneration.</li> <li>The CMC member say that teachers come and go but do not teach properly.</li> <li>CMC requested to provide a Middle School and a TLS.</li> </ul>

<b>Food and nutrition</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Consortium Dutch NGO's (CDN) distributed food ration on 2, October, 2014. In total, 395 households (total populations is 1,790) received the food ration.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC requested to include new born population in ration list.</li> </ul>
<b>Health Services</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) provided transportation facilities for emergency patients.</li> <li>• Government Department of Health provided polio vaccination for under than 5 children and pregnant women on 3 November. 83 (36 female) under 5 children and 57 pregnant women benefitted.</li> <li>• Myanmar of Health dependents had taken polio vaccination for on 3.11.2014.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC requested to increase clinical service time in camp. ICRC responded that they have plan to increase in 2015.</li> </ul>
<b>NFIs</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No any activity regarding NFI in the camp.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• IDPs requested to provide Mosquito Net, winter clothes, cooking utensils with food store gallon and iron box.</li> </ul>
<b>Shelter</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Infrastructures in camps were assessed. 42 shelters out of 52 were found partial damage and need repair. Similarly drainage system in the camp is need improvement.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• LWF will provide repair and maintenance support within December.</li> </ul>
<b>WASH</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Save the Children International (SCI) organized a 5 days long cleaning (drain, gutter and road) campaign.</li> <li>• Save the Children International (SCI) has been monitored condition of toilets and hand pumps once in every week.</li> <li>• Save the Children International (SCI) has been provided ceramic filter for this month in the camp. Similarly, WASH awareness training for mother groups were accomplished by SCI.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• SCI will organize health education awareness training for children and mothers as well to protect from cholera in the camp.</li> </ul>
