IDPs and Returnees were covered by DTM Round XVI

IOM manages the Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) in Nigeria and other countries round the world to support humanitarian communities with data on displacement and mobility. This information management product determines the status, locations, and needs of people displaced by the ongoing conflict in Northeast Nigeria. As of April 30, 2017, the DTM has identified 1,884,331 IDPs (339,362 households) across Adamawa, Bauchi, Borno, Gombe, Taraba, and Yobe states. This represents an increase from 1,832,743 individuals in Round XV, reflecting the continuing trend of IDPs returning to their Local Government Areas, particularly in Borno state. Although, most of these IDPs still retain their status because they could not return to their actual places of abode. Assessments were carried out from the 3rd of April -12th of April 2017.






IDPs by Site Type and States




IDPs Distribution by LGAs

Food Security Level of the Return Area




