

NEED ANALYSIS

- January 2015 has been characterized by intense attacks of Boko Haram members of BOKO Haram in Nigeria, Niger, Cameroon and Chad and these attacks have provoked displacements in Chad of 118,804 people according to the DTM data at the end of January 2017. These people are often with few possessions and in need of assistance in, food, water and sanitation, health services, shelter and NFIs.
- •Despite low intensity Boko Haram attacks on Chad, there is still security problems in Lac region, with movement restriction in some parts and there is no indication of return to the place of origin for the displaced as military operations continue.

RESPONSE

The cluster has two coordination levels, twice a month at the national level in N'djamena and twice a month in Bagasola, Lake region, where the validation of new displaced figures takes place. The cluster organizes also field missions to meet new displaced people and identify needs.

GAPS / CHALLENGES

- Due to lack of funds the DTM that was the source of data on displaced persons and their intentions ended in February 2017.
- Resource mobilization for the cluster coordination is a challenge
- IDPs' sites and villages spread on a wide geographical area coupled by security issues in some parts of the region makes information collection and sharing difficult
