




Top 10 nationalities* of Mediterranean sea arrivals in Q1-Q2 2017




Distribution per country of sea arrivals






Most common countries of asylum in the EU (Jan-Apr 2017)






Most common nationalities of asylum applications (Jan-Apr 2017)






