<p><b><u>Jordan Response Plan 2018-2020:</u></b> Eddie Dutton of UNESCO in his capacity as the Focal Point of Education JRP Secretariat explained what Jordan Response Plan was. The Government of Jordan through MoPIC leads the process and MoE chairs the Education Task Force of Education JRP to ensure the alignment of Education JRP with HRD and Education Strategic Plan currently being finalized.</p> <p>The following points were also presented:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The role and responsibilities of Task Force of Education JRP.</li> <li>• JRP components comprising Comprehensive Vulnerable Assessment (CVA) and JRP sector narrative and project sheet.</li> <li>• Education JRP structure is within three key pillars of access, quality and system strengthening leading to reaching the overall outcome objective under refugee and/or resilience components.</li> <li>• <u>Timeline of JRP and next steps.</u></li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Partners to submit their JRP Focal Point/s (name, title, email and mobile number) to Coordinator/Co-coordinator <b>by latest 17 August 2017.</b></li> <li>• Partners to share any relevant documents to ESWG/the Secretariat ASAP to be considered as one of reference documents for CVA.</li> <li>• The Education JRP Secretariat to share the draft of CVA, Sector Vulnerability Assessment and sector impact with sector partners' before it is finalized <b>by 17 August 2017.</b></li> <li>• The JRP Secretariat to complete sector narrative of JRP and project summary sheet by 12 September 2017.</li> </ul>
<p><b><u>Learning for All 2017-2018 Campaign (L4A):</u></b> Faizah, UNICEF Education M&amp;E Specialist briefly presented on the progress of L4A activities.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Trainings for partners were conducted to deliver outreach, data collection and awareness raising activities in host community and camps before it was started on 6 August 2017.</li> <li>• Communication materials such as posters, banners, billboards and others have been produced to convey key messages of the L4A campaign to get all children to go to school when new Academic Year commences in the beginning of September 2017.</li> <li>• 240 Facilitators have been recruited to be deployed to double shifted schools and district education offices to support the registration of children and data collection for EMIS. The facilitators are recruited through third company with the approval of MoE.</li> <li>• All partners are welcome to take part during the campaign and to coordinate with UNICEF to avoid duplication and overlapping so as to reach all children including the most vulnerable to enroll ahead of new Academic Year.</li> </ul>	<p>Partners to contact Coordinator/Co-coordinator ASAP to be linked with UNICEF Education Focal Point for L4A campaign if they are interested to conduct L4A activities in host community.</p>
