ISWG Updates	<p>1st Quarter Financial Tracking System</p> <p>This year the financial tracking covers both refugee and resilience pillar of the 3RP Inter-Agency Appeal. Final version will be posted in the portal site.</p> <p>Minimum Expenditure Basket MEB</p> <p>The sector discussion on MEB took place for the past few weeks. Shelter component divided into three aspects; (1) cost of rent, (2) cost of utility, and (3) household assets.</p> <p>What Shelter started to look at is rent and utility cost will be taken from different sectors; water from WASH and electricity from energy. Cost of rent will be calculating individually (per person).
