| Camp statistics, as of 22.05 | <p>Andrea Paiato, CCCM Cluster Coordinator (CC), presented the updated CCCM camp list and statistics as of 22nd of May (last version: 19 March).</p> <p>In summary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- 139.416 IDPs live in 76 sites <p>Sittwe:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- 579 Rakhine IDPs have been relocated from 17 monasteries to the new opened camp of Set Yone Su 3.- Bu May Ohn Taw Shore camp has been consolidated with Bu May Ohn Taw camp at the beginning of April.- 1177 IDPs have been relocated from temporary site to long houses in Ohn Taw Gyi 3- The temporary planned site (Koica tents) Maw Ti Ngar (TKP west), has been added to the camp list (1122 IDPs) <p>Maungdaw:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- 2 Rakhine camps closed <p>It has been acknowledged statistics are imperfect at this stage.</p> <p>Though the statistics aim to reflect changing in camp population due to spontaneous movement of IDPs occurred before alleged cyclone Mahasen, the situation remains fluid on ground and further changing are</p> | <p>UNHCR Information Management team: to work for improving methodology of data collection at camp level and develop a simple system of tracking movements</p> |

| | <p>expected in the next days/weeks (especially Pauktaw township).</p> <p>Additionally, the (unshared) Governmental relocation plan in Sittwe might consinstenly change the future camp scenario.</p> | |
| IMS (dashboard, 3Ws, contact list) | <p>CC: The imperative need of establishing and Information Management System at intra and inter-camp level is still widely unmet.</p> <p>A model of camp dashboard, including 3W matrix and contact list of key camp stakeholders has been shared with the participants; it got appreciation and partners encouraged the prompt roll out.</p> <p>The dashboard is intended to be and easy-to-read profile of the camp (population statistics, disaggregated data per age and sex, PWSNs, place of origin, key sectorial indicators).</p> <p>It has been highlighted that full consensus around the sectorial indicators to be included in the tool has yet to be achieved, especially for WASH and Nutrition, and information collection from service providers represents still a challenge.</p> <p>In order to have more details on sectorial coverage at camp level, there is agreement for in depth comprehensive 3W matrix for mapping presence in the camps.</p> | <p>CC: continue working on building consensus around the sectorial indicators, reiterate the importance of having clear detailed 3W matrix and clarify with partners methodology for data collection (3W, identified indicators)</p> |
| Shelter allocation in Sittwe township, updating | <p>CC: Update about governmental shelter construction plan in Sittwe rural area has been provided, underscoring lack of clarity about future comprehensive relocation plan of IDP communities within the area.</p> <p>The current number of shelter under construction or in the pipeline (774), are sufficient to cover the Pauktaw and Kiauk Phyu IDPs currently living in Sittwe rural area.</p> <p>The Cluster is in contact with the Township Administration Officer, who usually shares information about relocation actions, but with very short notice.</p> | <p>CC: continue work for enhancing connection between the Cluster and key Ministries, including Social Affairs and Government Administration Department. This connection is essential to be involved in joint planning and field interventions</p> |
