

Situation Overview

Inter-community conflict in Rakhine State, which erupted in early June 2012 and resurfaced in October 2012, has resulted in displacement and loss of lives and livelihoods. As of beginning of April 2013, the number of people displaced in Rakhine State has surpassed 139,000, of whom about 75,000 displaced since June 2012 and the remaining following October. Many others continue living in tents close to their places of origin while their houses are being rebuilt, or with host families. The IDP population is currently hosted in 76 camps and camp-like settings. The Shelter/NFI/CCCM Cluster was activated in December 2012 in Yangon. Only more recently (middle March 2013) did the CCCM Cluster become operational in Rakhine State. Therefore the sectoral response is still at a very early stage at field level.


Number of IDP sites by township

Type of accommodation at IDP sites


'Planned / Managed Camp' purpose-built sites where services and infrastructure is provided including water supply, food distribution, non-food item, education, and health care, usually exclusively for the population of the site.

'Self-Settled Camp' IDPs themselves spontaneously creating camps not officially planned.


'Collective Centre' IDPs are living together in a pre-existing public building such as a church, monastery, community centre, warehouse or school etc.

'Individual Accommodation' IDPs are living in their own dwellings and are not in camps. Also includes IDPs who are being privately hosted.

Number of IDP sites by type of accommodation




IDP population by type of accommodation
